The following features have been incorporated in the LMS in the academic year 2019-20. The LMS can be accessed in the desktops and in the mobile devices through an android mobile app.

#### **NEW FEATURES OF LMS**

- LMS has a new smart look and user friendly features.
- Web conferencing application Zoom was integrated for Live class / Seminar/ Workshop / Special Lecture / Training Program / Virtual Counseling / Online Interview etc.
- ❖ Feedback & Certification through LMS for some special programs has been implemented.
- Course Completion report was introduced for better introspection and analysis.
- ❖ Weekly format in the course section was designed and with the help of these restrictions, resources in the LMS would open in due date & time.
- ❖ Features for easy communication with the peer group, teacher added in the Discussion Forum.
- Email notifications implemented in connection with the content update in LMS.
- The Badges implemented to reinforce students for completing activities

- The LMS platform implemented provisions for grouping of learners into various learning groups. Specific mentors can be assigned to the groups as necessary
- \* Regional language MCQ support has been implemented in the LMS platform.

An online survey has been conducted by NSOU to assess the effectiveness of NSOU ICT services provided during the year 2019-20.




A total of 1469 students responded to the questionnaire.


The result of the survey has been analysed and will be used to improve the web offerings in future.


#### The following are the key findings of survey


- 1. More than 96% respondents are in the age group 18-35 years.
- 2. Around 68% respondents are from rural area.
- 3. Around 96% respondents have used smartphones while availing ICT services.
- 4. More than 88% respondents used mobile internet service while availing ICT services.
- 5. Only around 25% uses e-SLMs while more than 86% depend on Study Centres for their delivery of course materials.
- 6. Only 8% disagree and 2% strongly disagree over the preference of online classes in comparison with attending Personal Contact Programmes (PCPs) at study centres.
- 7. 45% of the respondents agree on their ability to learn better on digital platform.




































































#### **Recommendations:**
