Introduction of the esteemed speaker: To do the honours, the MoC requested Professor Anirban Ghosh, Director, Centre for Internal Quality Assurance to kindly introduce the session and the illustrious speaker. Prof. Ghosh introduced Prof. Sajal Nag with poise and grace. Prof. Sajal Nag is currently a Senior Professor, Department of History and Dean, School of Social Sciences, Assam University, Silchar. He was the first Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Chair Professor of Social Sciences, Presidency University, Kolkata, a former Commonwealth Fellow 2004-05 to United Kingdom, Charles Wallace Fellow at the University of Cambridge 2008 and Senior Fellow at Nehru Memorial Museum and Library,

2013-2014. He was a Senior Visiting Fellow at Queen's University, Belfast and also a Visiting Fellow at Wolfson College, University of Cambridge. His main areas of interest are nationalist thought, nationalism, communalism and ethnic conflict in India in general and north east India in particular. His recent shift in interest is towards environment and climatic history in South Asia. He has numerous publications-national and international to his credits. Prof Ghosh then invited Prof. Sajal Nag to deliver the much-awaited foundation day lecture (FDL) entitled, "The Invisible Mahatma: Millenarian Impact of Gandhi and Anti-colonial Resistance".
