Session-1: Creating Inclusive Learning Environment: Vistas, Trends and Blends

Speaker: **Dr. Papiya Upadhyay**, Assistant Professor, Education, NSOU presented the topic with vivid PPT and interaction with the faculties. She assented on the diversity in learning, learner and methods of teaching with technology. She equaled that inclusive nature of technology plays a crucial role in creating multiple means of engagement, presentation and actions and expressions followed by assistive technologies in education. Bridging the gaps in educational access, created by geographical and socio-economic barriers, is of utmost importance to emerge as an educational superpower in the 21st century. To achieve targets of universal educational access, application of appropriate technology is the call of the day. Also, making such technology-centered educational targets low-cost and easily accessible would allow students from disadvantaged backgrounds as well as remote areas to explore the educational landscape with ease.





Session-2:OER and ethics in Education

Speaker: **Prof. Arun K Chakraborty**, Head, LIS, NSOU emphatically spoke on the ideas and concept of Open Educational Resources (OERs), library and digitalization of books. He also emphasized on the ethical realms in publication and hinted upon the issues related to plagiarism and technological interventions.

Session-3: Blended learning

Speech by **Mr. Matin Ahmed**, faculty member of the college briefed on Concept of Blended Learning through a well knitted words and assumptions, exemplified with the notion of promises and opportunities for the future.

Session-4: Creating Inclusive Learning Environment: Blended Learning-from concept to practice

Speaker: **Prof. Anirban Ghosh**, Director, CIQA, NSOU eloquently presented his ideas and thoughts on the evolution of educational practices with means, modes, materials and matrix of contemporary needs of 21st century learners' aspirations.
