About the Memorial Lecture:



Programme Sequence




The programme set off with an apt compeering by Prof. Sumanta Chattaraj, SoE, NSOU. The entire programme unfurled sequentially through the following sessions:

Welcome Address was delivered by *C.A. Kishore Sengupta*, Registrar, NSOU. He greeted all academicians, dignitaries, employees of NSOU, invitees with warmth and dignity. He also briefed on the glorious past, rejuvenating present and a promising future of NSOU.

About the University was outlined by *Professor Anirban Ghosh*, Director, CIQA, NSOU. In a nutshell, Prof. Ghosh threw light on the University's major achievements, be it curricular or extended activities. The motto of reaching the unreached to a huge learner base was possible only through technology-enhanced and supported education. And as he emphasized that NSOU is the only University in west Bengal to have a steady ICT support for teaching-learning purposes. His short deliberation wringed upon University's entwined activities and engagement in multifarious extension activities to upsurge the societal reach through the motto of meeting the unmet.



Introducing the Theme of the event was delivered by by *Dr. A. N Dey*, Director, SoE, NSOU in a very lucid and contextual manner. Prof. Swapan K Sarkar was invited to elaborate on the focus of the lecture. He justified his short speech reminding the basic tenets of Swamiji's life and activities. He also highlighted the relevance of the lecture titled for deliberation.



The Swami Vivekananda Memorial Lecture:

1st Swami Vivekananda Memorial Lecture was delivered by *Swami Dr. Sashtrajnananda*, Principal, Ramakrishna Mission Residential College, Narendrapur, W.B. The title of his lecture was *'Concept of Freedom and Ideas of Swami Vivekananda'*. Swamiji transported that

Vivekananda's concept of freedom, appears to be quite transcendental. He points out that the whole universe is in constant motion towards freedom. He not only advocates spiritual freedom or emancipation from the bonds of Maya but also stands for the freedom in its totality - physical, mental and spiritual. He enlightened everyone with Swamiji's man making and character-building education.



He continued his enticing lecture by quoting, 'It was Swami Vivekananda who showed that the freedom and purity of the Atman can form the basis of human thinking and actions. Swamiji laid the foundation for a truly ontological theory of ethics which is much superior to the deontological and hedonistic theories mentioned above. It makes ethics a study of the way the freedom of the Self manifests itself in a multitude of ways. This does not mean that Swami Vivekananda overlooked the evil tendencies in man or the compulsive nature of human actions. Man as man is not divine, but he has in him the potential to become divine.

The soul's divinity and freedom remain in a potential state because their manifestation is restricted by mental and physical automatisms. All normal thinking, feeling and willing are controlled by latent impression of past experiences called samskaras. It is under the influence of samskaras that people do good actions or bad actions. His one-hour lecture was captivating inspirational and motivating.

Presidential Address was delivered by Professor Subha Sankar Sarkar, Hon'ble Vice-

Chancellor, NSOU. Prof. Sarkar, in his speech referred to the glimpses of the memorial lecture and added nuances of facts and facets to match up with the contemporary world. He also offered his gratitude to Swami Shastrajnananda for his eloquence and wisdom.

Vote of thanks was proposed by *Dr. Papiya Upadhyay*, Assistant Professor, SoE, NSOU. She

thanked one and all present and associated in/with the event to make it a grand success.
