Sangita was overwhelmed to say that it was a great opportunity for her to speak in front of so many young minds. By celebrating this special day, she preferred to promote entrepreneurship for women. She welcomed all to support each other and grow together. In 2018, Sangita Sen established SunnyRay Solutions. It deals with solar plant installation, maintenance, and sales.
