#### **Proceedings of the webinar:**

The empathetic roles as portrayed in cinemas, as remarked by Prof. Mandal showed a light of hopes that disability problems can be addressed through these perspectives. He rightly suggested for frequent awareness, sensitization and discussion on these themes will count a positive impact on the society in particular and nation in general. He cited numerous examples from literature and movies where disability/differences have been featured with heroic expression. His views on the problems of disability today lies in the crude mindsets of the so called non-disabled or abled society-a construct created by the human society itself. He advised to break/dismantle these shackles and set free the accepting mind and contribute towards an inclusive society.



The 50 minutes lecture was gripping, illuminating and thought-provoking. It filled the minds of the attendees with spirit and hopes of change.

The webinar drew close. Smt. Swapna Deb, Consultant, Special Education, SoE was requested to propose the formal vote of thanks. She expressed her sincere thanks to one and all in making up of the event.
