Overture

India being the sixth most dangerous countries for journalism in the world, after Afghanistan, Mexico, Syria, Somalia, and Yemen. Still, we have not seen any process to make safety modules for young journalists. The research project will map the issues faced by journalists, as well as how they operationalize current codes of practise, in order to create a set of country-specific journalistic rules.

This will provide an evidence base for capacity building workshops with journalists and development of tentative journalism curricula. Working with tandem with various agencies will help in building capacity to help educators at the higher education level to create a culture that promotes safety modules for all aspiring journalism and communication students. After various brain-storming sessions, the present study will be able to develop tentative modules for risk reporting which will include safety of female journalists, covering civil unrest, reporting during COVID-19 pandemic interviewing hostile sources, safety of photo journalists, significance of diversity in newsrooms, reporting on foreign conflicts, and reporting during natural calamities.

The research will mostly be qualitative and analytical. While major part of the objectives will be achieved through primary sources such as in-depth interviews and workshops, an overview of the different implications of security issues while reporting will be provided.

Considering the backdrop, department of journalism and mass communication under the aegis of the School of Humanities organized a research colloquium with the objective to orient the students and other guests on different contours of freedom of press in India .

Objectives:

- 1. Awareness on the present situation of Press Freedom in India
- 2. Orientation on the need of Press Freedom in India
- 3. Clarify doubts faced by the learners concerning Press Freedom

The one-day research colloquium illuminated the minds of many by bringing forth the opportunity for discussion among the illuminati from the sphere of media. The focus of the colloquium was on 'Press Freedom in India' was very much appropriate and needs pondering upon. Learners interested on the topic were urged to register for the colloquium to take full advantage of the lecture. The colloquium was also conducted via Google meet for the online participants.

Speaker- Shri Jayanta Ghosal- With over 35 years of experience, Jayanta Ghosal started out as a staff reporter in Bartaman in 1984. He was the editor (Delhi) ABP. He is now working as the Consulting Editor, India Today Group.

Programme Flow: The research colloquium progressed systematically through :

Excerpts of the Addresses:

Opening: The colloquium started with a brief inaugural in the presence of a host of guests and participants. The 'dignitaries of the Inaugural Session included Professor Manan Kumar Mandal, Director, School of Humanities, Prof. Sarmistha Chatterjee, Professor of ELT, NSOU, Dr. Srideep Mukherjee, Associate Professor and Head, Dept. of English, and Dr. Baidyanath Bhattacharya, Associate Professor of JMC, NSOU. Arijit Ghosh, Assistant Professor of JMC and Principal Investigator of the NSOU Sponsored Research project acted as the host on the occasion.

Arijit Ghosh, Assistant Professor of Journalism and Mass Communication, while introducing the theme to the participants emphasized that freedom of the press in India is not absolute. It is believed to be covered under Freedom of Speech and Expression.

"As of 2021, 6 journalists have been killed because of their work. India is among the top 4 countries with the greatest number of deaths on record. Journalists have been targeted and attacked due to their work", he added. The colloquium, he believed, would not only help the participants in knowing the present status of press freedom in India but it would also help them to understand the different nuances of press freedom.

Prof. Manan Kumar Mandal, Director, School of Humanities, in his speech welcomed all the participants who attended the event. He spoke briefly on the catchy details of NSOU. He
