### **REPORT OF IKSLISAD-2023**

1st International Seminar is being organized by the Department of Library & Information Science (**DLIS**), School of Professional Studies (**SPS**), Netaji Subhas Open University (**NSOU**), DD-26, Saltlake City, Sector-1, Kolkata 700064, West Bengal with the financial assistance for the Raja Rammohun Roy Library Foundation (**RRRLF**), Ministry of Culture, Government of India, DD-34, Salt Lake City, Sector-I, Kolkata 700 064 during **24-26<sup>th</sup> March**, **2023** at NSOU Saltlake Campus, Saltlake, Kolkata. The theme of the International Seminar is "*Indian Knowledge System for LIS and Allied Disciplines (IKS-LISAD:2023)"*.

The inaugural programme started at 2.00 PM in the "Subhas Chandra Sabhagriha", NSOU, Salt Lake, Kolkata. The inaugural session was Chaired by the Professor Ranjan Chakraborti, Dept. of History, Jadavpur University, Kolkata, Vice-Chancellor (Former), NSOU, Kolkata and Vidyasagar University, Midnapur, Chief Patron of IKSLISAD-2023. Welcome address was delivered by Prof. Anirban Ghosh, Director (i/c) SPS, NSOU and Patron of IKSLISAD-2023. The theme of the seminar was introduced by Prof. Arun Kumar Chakraborty, HOD, DLIS, NSOU and IKSLISAD-2023 Seminar Director. Keynote address was delivered by Swami Suparnananda Maharaj, Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission Institute of Culture, Golpark. Speech of the Chief Guest delivered by Prof. Ajay Pratap Singh, Director General, National Library & RRRLF, Govt. of India. #### **Inaugural Session (DAY-1: 24-03-2023 2.00 PM)**

Ms. Priyanthi Bagchi, Assistant Professor, Department of Economics, NSOU, Kolkata compered the program and conducted the felicitation to the guest first. After felicitation she called Director, SPS to deliver welcome address.

Prof. Anirban Ghosh, Director SPS (I/C) and Director CIQA and Patron of IKSLISAD-2023 extended his warm welcome to all the distinguished speakers, guests and the participants to the three days international seminar on Indian Knowledge System (IKSLISAD-2023). He gave a brief background of NSOU and shared how the university has grown up since 1997 and has been accredited with A+ grade by NAAC. The NSOU has five campuses across the West Bengal (Saltlake –HQ, Newtown (upcoming new campus), Regional centre (Kalyani, Duragapur, Jalpaiguri). NSOU caters around two lakhs learners across 33 courses (disciplines) PCP through RCs and around 175 centres across the State. The NSOU has made significant achievements during this period.







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Prof. Arun Kumar Chakraborty, HOD, DLIS and Seminar Director expressed his warm greetings and expressed his gratitude to all the University authorities and the Director General RRRLF and officials of Ministry of Culture, Government of India for financially or otherwise supporting the IKSLISAD-2023. He also expressed his gratitude to entire organizing committee headed by the Honble Vice Chancellor Sir & Director SPS and all the members of Advisory committee as well as entire organizing committee. He also profusely thanked the institute authorities, officials and staff members who have contributed whole heartedly to make the program success. He explained the relevance and need of the seminar. He explained how IKS in different subjects facilitating across the globe to attain new high. He introduced the chief guest and the speakers. He said that about 92 papers from LIS and allied areas have been selected for the presentation out of which more than 30% of the selected papers are from other than the LIS field i.e. allied field across the subjects like science, medicine, economics, history, sociology etc. The seminar sessions would be delivered by galaxy of luminaries across the field and across the globe as a plenary lecture / invited speakers / joint moderators etc. more than 10 plenary lectures and more than 30 people from across the globe. He concluded his lecture with a hope of obtain lots of innovative ideas would emerge from this three days extensive seminar. He also stated the objectives of the seminar is to identify the components of IKS in the different disciplines and how it has been contributing to build New India as well as how across the globe humanity is benefitted.

Prof. Ranjan Chakraborti, Prof in History, Jadavpur University and former Vice Chancellor of NSOU and Vidyasagr University as well as he was mentor of the IKSLISAD-2023. According to Prof Chakraborti, true knowledge can be obtained by adopting some methodology. Knowledge may be both scientific as well as non-scientific. Oral histories, chronicles are good source of scientific history. He said it is not possible to meet all the members of a community therefore we can have an "imaginary community" who can be help us in getting information, and this can be a way to revive the indigenous knowledge.

Swami Suparnananda Maharaj Ji spoke about two kinds of knowledge-*Apore Vidya and Aatme Vidya*. The 1<sup>st</sup> kind of knowledge is the universal knowledge, i.e what we see around us, these knowledge does not need any interpretation, however the 2<sup>nd</sup> type of knowledge is the knowledge of self, we have to apply our inner sense, intellectual to understand this type of knowledge and this type of knowledge is the true knowledge. We have to enlighten our soul and mind to reach *Aatmevidya*. Only meditation and good work can help us to attain *Aatmevidya* or the true knowledge.

Prof. Ajay Pratap Singh, DG, National Library and DG RRRLF in his chief guest address said that our past is very rich. However, India underwent the 'Black Era' when the invaders came to our land and destroyed all the valuable documents. The ancient knowledge system could not reach the future generation and this was a big loss to our culture. However we still have religious documents like Puran, and Gita which teaches reality of life. Unfortunately we could not popularize these documents in our community. The Public Libraries must be established in every community, not only in urban areas but also in rural belts so that the people can once again get connected to these valuable knowledge systems.







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Guest of honour Sh. Jason Fraira, has been a 15 year member of the Diplomatic Security Service, arrived in Kolkata in October 2022. Domestically he was an investigator for the DS Field offices in Boston, MA and San Francisco, CA as well as lead advance for the Secretary of State's Protective Detail for three years. Prior to joining DSS, he had an 8-year career as a secondary school teacher of US History and government from American Library. While addressing the audience Sh. Jason said that American library which is a digitalized library, has a rich repository of knowledge there are about 12000 books, journals articles on American culture. The library provides the facility for borrowing the books. The library would extend all kind of academic support whenever required. He look forward to cooperation with these academic community of NSOU as well as different institutes participants.

Chief Guest, Dr. Swarup Prasad Ghosh. Director, Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Institute of Asian Studies, Kolkata (MAKAIS), Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India. Dr. Ghosh served as Registrar, Dean of Controller of Examinations in different academic institutes of repute. Dr. Ghosh critically explained the Indian ethos and value systems exist in IKS and how we could enrich our society through this system, Dr. Ghosh also shared that Asia is a land where Jesus and prophet were born, this is the land of Budhha and Mahavira. Report of Day – II IKSLISAD 2023, Technical Session – IA (SCS) (Parallel Session)

Theme: IKS-LIS Issues and Community Information System and Services Reinforcing IKS

□ Prof. Susmita Chakraborty, DLIS, University of Calcutta, West Bengal delivered her lecture on Knowledge Management System. She mentioned about the different components of Knowledge Management which are people, process, content/IT and strategy. Regardless of the industry, size or knowledge needs of your organization, you always need people to lead, sponsor and support knowledge sharing. She then presented on needs of knowledge management in libraries where knowledge acquisition is the starting point of knowledge management in libraries. Knowledge management is important because it boosts the efficiency of an organization's decision-making ability. By making sure that all employees have access to the overall expertise held within the organization, a smarter workforce is built that is more able to make quick, informed decisions, benefitting the entire company

□ Prof. Sudip Ranjan Hatua, DLIS, RBU, Kolkata, West Bengal delivered his lecture on Indian culture − A Strong Knowledge base. Indian culture, often labeled as a combination of several cultures has been influenced by a history that is several years old, beginning with the Indus Valley Civilization and other early cultural areas. Many elements of Indian culture have had a profound impact across the Greater India and the world. Hinduism itself formed from various distinct folk religions, which merged during the Vedic period and the following periods. He mentioned how Indians tend to have a strong sense of pride in the distinctiveness and diversity of their culture. Moreover, a considerable amount of pride steams from India's rich artistic cultural exports of music, fine arts, literature and spirituality.

□ Dr. Vijay Raghav Tiwary, Librarian, IISER, Kalyani, West Bengal delivered his lecture on Role of Librarian in Promoting Digital Transformation Literacy. He mentioned that having a digitally literate workforce is essential for any organization looking to transform itself. Employees who are digitally literate are able to understand and use new technologies to improve their work process and increase efficiency. Employees are also better equipped to identify opportunities for digital transformation and to develop strategies to take advantage of them. He mentioned how digital literacy is not just about understanding technology but also understanding the business context in which it is being used. To develop digital transformation literacy, organizations should provide training and education opportunities for employees.









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□ Dr. Kishore Satpathy, Chief Librarian, ISI, Kolkata, West Bengal delivered his lecture on Documenting Traditional Knowledge: Mapping best practices of the Indigenous Committees in NER He mentioned how Traditional Knowledge (TK) is knowledge, know-how, skills and practices that are developed, sustained and passed on from generation to generation within a community, often forming a part of its culture or spiritual identity. TK in general sense embraces the content of knowledge itself as well as traditional cultural expressions, including distinctive signs and symbols associated with TK. TK in the narrow sense refers to knowledge as such, in particular, the knowledge resulting from intellectual activity in a traditional context, and includes know-how, practices, skills and innovations.

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
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
