Then all learner who attended the session were asked to give their self-introduction and interacted with the faculties of the centre. Prof. Ghosh wished all the learners for their joyful learning ahead.

**Dr. Sudarshan Roy,** Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce, NSOU and Course Coordinator of Diploma in Personal Income Tax: Planning and Filing, briefly discussed about the course content of the and what the learners are about to learn or take home away from the course. Discussed about the class routine, class notes, study materials, assignments, class tests, examination patterns etc. Dr. Roy stressed on the importance of attempting class test / weekly tests as a part of the continues assessment and progress of the learners.

**Ms. Priyanthi Bagchi**, Assistant Professor of Economics, NSOU and Course Coordinator of Diploma in Banking and Finance (DBF), explained about the course structure and modalities. Ms. P. Bagchi also discussed about tentative class routine, study material of the course, assignments, class tests and evaluation and assessment process. 
