1. Concept of Open University

An open learning system is one in which the onus of learning is primarily on the students. Despite this, they are formally enrolled in a system which takes in other learners too. Thus, we draw a line of distinction between the above-mentioned category of students and (a) those borrowing books from Libraries and (b) those formally attached to a conventional university where classroom teaching is the principal mode of instruction.

The Open University represents and alternative approach to higher learning. It stands apart from a highly formal, institutionalized and centrally administered system of education. Its philosophy is built around the principles of universality, flexibility and innovativeness. Its ideas and institutions, its methods and procedures are all shaped accordingly. Conceptually, it can be viewed as a system drawing upon the best elements in formal and non-formal education.

The 'openness' consists of a variety of features. First, it offers easy access to the learners. The entry requirement is not too exacting. A genuine interest in picking up knowledge is all that it expects. Consequently, it would try to embrace as many learners as possible.

Second, its territorial reach is visible wide. It aims at bringing education to the doorstep of the learner, wherever he or she may be. Various methods of communication and contact are used for this purpose. The classroom of the university, thus, is as wide as the entire land it seeks to serve.

Third, the Open University is learner-oriented. It devises its course and methods of teaching to suit the needs of the learners. Their options and inclinations are given due priorities. A variety of courses – short-term or long-term, liberal or professional – can be pursued under the university.

Fourth, it believes in fair distribution of quality education, teaching aid, consultancy and study materials. Whatever resources the university has are made evenly available to all learners wherever or whoever he or she might be. It eliminates variations and discrimination.

Fifth, its administration is decentralized. In promoting Distance Education, the university creates a wide network of Study Centres. Students need only to come to the nearest available centre for collecting all information, completing all formalities, discussing their academic issues and appearing for evaluation of their work at intervals chosen by them.

Sixth, student assessment under Open University is based on continuous assessment and credit system. It does not require students to get bogged down in one final examination. One can study at one's own pace.

In short, the Open University seeks to open up the treasure house of knowledge

to the maximum number of users. Thereby it would enhance their skills for productivity and further learning. Socially, too, the university promises steady empowerment of those who suffered backwardness for want of these skills. Considering the current trends all over the world, the Open University is going not only to complement the conventional system of higher education but may soon occupy the centre stage also in developing countries where the resources do not measure up to the vastness of the clientele.

2. About Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU)

Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU) was established as State Open University in 1997 by an Act of West Bengal State Legislature (West Bengal Act XIX of 1997) and is recognized by the UGC-Distance Education Bureau (DEB) since its inception. NSOU has now emerged as major leader of Open and Distance Education in India and has drawn national as well as international visibility due to its phenomenal growth. The University has clocked about 4,50,000 learners till date. Currently, the University is offering a prodigious variety of courses and programmes at its 162 Study Centres spread all over the State of West Bengal.

Towards the goal of spreading higher education in different parts of the State, to provide wide access to higher education and to different skill enhancing educational programmes, NSOU provides quality education in a flexible mode to serve the aim of establishing an equitable knowledge society within the State. The School of Vocational Studies regularly organizes seminar/workshop on various topics of importance in present days contexts for sharing and widening of knowledge.

3. About School of Vocational Studies (SVS)

Open and Distance Learning is increasingly becoming popular because of its flexibility and learner friendly approach, particularly to those who could not get access to the formal education system. Netaji Subhas Open University is not only imparting education as an alternative to the formal system of education i.e. conventional courses, but also in areas such as vocational and non-conventional courses. This is the area where the distance education can be used extensively to provide education that can prepare skilled workforce for the society. The University is providing vocational and non-conventional courses so that the learners can engage themselves in income-generating livelihood. In the globalised era the Indian economy is one of the fastest growing economies in the world and it needs skilled and trained workforce. It is not possible for formal education system alone to provide desired

number of skilled workers. In such a situation, Netaji Subhas Open University is giving the opportunity to upgrade the skill of existing work force by providing seamless vocational education and platter of pioneering courses of non-conventional in nature.

4. About Centre for Lifelong Learning (CLL)

The Centre for Lifelong Learning under the aegis of School of Vocational Studies has been set up by the University vide the resolution of the 34th Academic Council meeting and ratified by the subsequent Executive Council meeting with the objective of providing Practical training to the freshers as well as existing workforce. The Centre for Lifelong Learning will generally provides the practical training to the candidates having no formal educational qualification but having prior learning experience which will lead to their life skill development. All such training would be provided in association with the study centres/ Partner Institutions.

5. Mission of the Centre (NSOU-SVS-CLL)

The Mission of the Centre is to work with learners of varied ages who would like to continue their education by taking up life skill development training/progarmmes. To this end, it offers short term training programme in various trades to bridge the gap between the demand and supply of skilled workforce. The basic objectives of these programmes are to focus upon work-related needs as also self-growth and individual development.

Reaching out beyond the four walls of the University, the Centre partners with civil society organisations to deliver the need based and modular training programmes at the door steps of the learners.

In addition to that the CLL will have the facility to provide training in other domain/ discipline for the already trained persons engaged in various activities for advancement of knowledge and further mobility in the workplace.

All such programmes will be delivered either through i) ICT based on-line mode, or ii) Contact mode or iii) Blended/ Hybrid mode i.e. combination of both (i) & (ii).

All the collaborative programmes carry a joint certification of the implementing partner (study centre) along with the Centre for Lifelong Learning (CLL), NSOU.

6. Admission Procedure

Admission schedule is notified in the website/ newspaper before the

commencement of each academic session together with Admission Form and will be available from the office of Study Centres of the University on Saturday and Sunday during their office hours. Completed Admission form along with prescribed fees is to be submitted to the Study Centres within the last date announced.

7. Payment of Fees

All such programmes are self-financed. There are three components in the fee structure viz. programme fees, ICT fees and cost of Prospectus-cum-Admission Form. Students need to pay the fees at the time of admission at the Study Centre.

The programme fees and other fees will be notified in the admission notification published by the University.

The students are required to pay examination fees of Rs. 100/- per paper before examination.

NB: (i) The study materials are available on the NSOU-OER Repository/LMS. No printed study material will be provided.

(ii) The registration will remain valid for the duration of the course concerned for a particular session.

8. Certification

The successful candidates of the programmes as stated will be given a completion certificate jointly issued by the study centre and the CLL. At the end the programmes, the Study Centre will conduct the assessment of the students under the supervision of CLL. The assessment would comprise class interaction, class participation, continuous assessment, performance in workshop and hands-on-training and also include viva voce etc. On the basis of the performance, the certificate will be issued jointly.
