Three Weeks Master Trainer Training on Tailoring for Women's Self Dependent

Through this project, CLL offers young women and girls an opportunity for empowerment through self-employment. The objective of this initiative is to transform participants' lives for sustainable development through the training in the areas like tailoring, soft toys, embroidery, food processing, handicrafts, apiculture etc.





In this back drop, the study centre namely Jaygopalpur Gram Vikash Kendra (V-41), Basanti organized "Three Weeks Master Trainer Training on Tailoring for Women's Self Dependent" at

their centre from 21/11/2023 to 14/12/2023. The training module includes i) Pattern Making, ii) Garment Construct, iii) Fashion & Textile Design, iv) Apparel & Textile Design etc. The study centre arranged all the facilities viz. physical infrastructure and the human resources to facilitate the training programme. They also provided the lodging facilities to the participants. They engaged domain knowledge experts from Denmark as the facilitator of all the sessions during the training programme. The master trainers (Facilitator) of the three-week training programme were i) Hornsleth Mette Hartvig, ii) Boese Susan. 25 participants from the districts 24Parganas (S) & (N) attended the programme







On the successful completion of the training programme, joint certificates (signed by the University representative and the Secretary of JGVK) were handed over to all the participants.
