  - d) Compare and contrast Christina Rossetti's poems 'A Dirge' and 'A Birthday'.

  - a) Examine the role of Boldwood in Far From the Madding Crowd.
  - b) Comment on the use of the sea as a metaphor in the poems, 'Dover Beach' and 'To Marguerite: Continued'.
  - c) Briefly examine the autobiographical elements in *Jane Eure*.
  - d) Attempt a critical appreciation of Tennyson's 'Break, Break, Break'.
  - e) What does Carlyle say about the poeticgenius of Shakespeare?
  - f) Describe the comic exaggerations of the Micawber family and their role in *David Copperfield*.

  - a) Assess the contributions of any *one* of the Victorian fictional prose writers:
    - i) George Eliot
    - ii) Charlotte Brontë.
