- c) Discuss the codes Barthes identified in S/Z. How did he illustrate the application of the codes?

- d) Discuss the similarities and differences between Hans Jauss's and Wolfgang Iser's Reception theories.
- e) Select a well-known poem and show how it can be deconstructed in the classroom to yield a different meaning.

- a) Briefly sum up Jacques Lacan's theory of the development of the human mind from the infant to the adult stage.
- b) Analyse the first phase of Feminism with reference to Virginia Woolf and Simone de Beauvoir.
- c) Write short notes on any two of the following:
 - (i) Fusion of Horizons
 - ii) Feminine, Feminist and Female stages
 - (iii) The id, the ego, the superego
 - (iv) Base and superstructure.

- d) Discuss the basic assumptions of New Historicism.
- e) Explain the ideas of Stanley Fish's "Affective Stylistics".
- f) What is the Structuralist theory of language?
