
- a) Comment on the various supporting materials, one would use while teaching 'Biography'.

- g) Discuss the strategies to use a comic or annotated text as a supporting material to teach in the classroom.




- a) Mention four strategies a teacher may use to introduce the notion of English epic in the class.

 - v) Hubris.


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- c) What are Romantic tragedies ? Refer to one of the Romantic tragedies and discuss the features of the same.
