#### **FOREWORD**

Netaji Subhas Open University was established by an Act of West Bengal State Legislative Assembly in 1997 to provide quality education in a flexible mode to serve the aim of establishing an equitable knowledge society and to make higher education affordable to the disadvantaged. At present, 4.50lakh of learners are enrolled in Under Graduate, Post Graduate Degree Programme and Vocational programmes at 149 study centres spread all over the State.

The objective of the open and distance learning institutions (ODLIs) is to provide the opportunities to learn to larger section of the people. The success of the ODLI is directly linked to high quality academic programs and more importantly how the programme is delivered and support services offered to the students. Technology enables the teachers to transmit more information to a larger number of students facilitating personalized learning. The major challenge of ODL system is to reach the mass. The educational contents i.e. the academic resources which are developed are mostly in print-form which involves huge cost as well as huge consumption of paper. Now, it may be appropriate to say the ODL as Open and Digital Learning instead of open and distance learning. Distance is no more there between the teachers and students or between university and students. The advancement of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) has brought new opportunities to restructure the teaching-learning process. The e-content may be solution for many challenges.

E-content is nothing but the non-print version of the course materials. It avoids duplication of work, minimizes cost and also protects the environment which in turn promotes the green practices. Now the question is how the e-contents would be made available to the public. Open Educational Resources (OER) would be the best option to reach the mass. OER is the e-content which is released under an appropriate CC license and is made available on the public domain free of cost.

Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU) with support of Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (CEMCA) has developed the NSOU-OER Repository with CC BY NC SA license on DSpace platform for its academic resources. Prior to this, the University conducted a series of seminars and workshops for awareness on OER/ E-content, hand-on training for development of E-content etc. All these initiatives have been taken in line with the COL's agenda of reaching the mass with quality academic resources for lifelong learning. The REPOSITORY was formally launched on 12 May 2017 by Professor Subha Sankar Sarkar, Vice-Chancellor, NSOU and Dr. Shahid Rasool, Director, CEMCA in presence of Professor Nageshwar Rao, Vice-Chancellor, Uttarakhand Open University & Professor Srikant Mohapatra, Vice-Chancellor, Odisha State Open University.

The present manual has been prepared by Dr. Barnali Roy Choudhury, Asst. Professor of Library and Information Science, NSOU which may be helpful to search the academic resources on the NSOU OER Repository (http://nsouoer.krc.net.in).












NSOU-OER home page consists two search options.






# Browsing by Communities and Collections of NSOU-OER

If you want to have a look on **NSOU-OER Repository** vividly then you may choose this path of learning.








# Search facility

You may filter your search query by using **Advance Search** option. Type your search term. Select option as per your preference and press Enter button.






## Search Result
