**13. To formalize the e-Tutoring and e-Mentoring for UG/ PG level (ANEEEX-VII)**

The proposal was accepted by the HOUSE and it was resolved that towards the end of the semester/ session, the Schools may organize e-Tutoring for 5-7 session as per need of the course. The Schedule may be prepared accordingly and uploaded on the website.

The following programmes have been identified for e-Mentoring under which the faculties may act as MENTOR for a particular group of learners through digital platform e.g. WhatsApp/ Telegram etc.

PG Degree: Geography, Zoology, Mathematics, Social Work, Library Science, Economics, ELT, English, Education

UG/ 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree: BLIS, B.Ed (Spl. Education)

The School/ faculty may maintain a proper record for future reference.

Other Departments may also come forward to extend their support to the learners.

**14. To consider the change in the nomenclature of Department of Commerce as Department of Commerce and Management and launching of MBA programme (ANNEX-VIII)**

The proposal was discussed in detail and resolved that the name of Department of Commerce may be changed to Department of Commerce and Management. Accordingly, *specialization in Management* may be added as Desirable Qualification/ Condition for recruitment in the Department of Commerce and Management in addition to the Essential Qualification prescribed by the UGC and /or G.O. of the State Govt.

The School of Professional Studies (SPS) may initiate necessary steps for launching MBA with the approval of AICTE.

**15. To consider the preparation of AQAR for NAAC portal**

The present accreditation (1<sup>st</sup> cycle) will remain valid up to 7/4/2026. The assessment period of next cycle of NAAC assessment and accreditation has already been started from 2019-20. The University has to submit the AQAR mandatorily in each year beginning from 2019-20. For collection of data, following AQAR Committee has been constituted.

Each Member in consultation with the Director/ Head will collect and compile the data/information for 2019-20 and 2020-21 from their respective school/ department in the prescribed format (to be provided by CIQA) and forward the same with supporting documents to CIQA latest by 20/11/2021. On behalf of CIQA, Dr. Ritu Mathur Mitra and Dr. Papiya Upadhyay may coordinate with the members of the committee.

**16. To consider the commencement of online classes (synchronous) for UG and PG Learners**

On receipt of admission data from the Registrar Department (latest by 1<sup>st</sup> week of Dec., 2021), the Service Provider will prepare the LMS for new batch of learners (2021-22). Schools may plan to commence the online counselling sessions for BDP/ UG (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year) from the month of December 2021. The online counselling sessions for PG (2<sup>nd</sup> year) / 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree programmes may be commenced from January 2022.

However, holding the normal PCPs of both UG and PG at LSCs may be explored by the Director (Study Centres) in view of the recently issued notification by the Higher Education Dept.-GoWB (Memo No. 1058-Edn(CS)/10M-32/2021 dated 28/10/2021).

**17. To consider the recording of AV Lectures at AV Studio at Hqtrs & Kalyani RC**

Now all the AV Studios are operational and faculties are permitted to attend the Institutions vide GO. No.1058-Edn(CS). So, Faculty members may be requested to record their lectures at studio on priority basis specially for UG-CBCS syllabus. The lectures may be used in LMS/ Web TV/ Web Radio-Muktak as per existing norms.

**18. To consider 4-colour cover with lamination for PG Programmes (new- MA in Economics, MA in Journalism and Mass Communication and revised syllabus- MA in ELT, MSW, M.Com.) as per SLM cover of UG-CBCS.**

Noted and approved by the HOUSE.

**19. To review the preparedness of the admission process in PG Degree/ 2nd Degree (UG Degree) and other programmes for 2021-22 session**

Reported that the prospectus for the new session is under revision. The admission notification for 13 existing PG programmes and 2 new PG programmes is likely to be published in the month of December'21 / January'22.

Director (Study Centres) may forward the list of LSCs willing to offer MA in Economics and MA in Journalism & Mass Communication to the Registrar Dept. for incorporation in the prospectus and admission portal/ website.

As already approved by RCI, the M.Ed. (Special Edn.) may also be launched in 2021-22 session on receipt of final approval from UGC-DEB.

### Sl. No.10. To finalize the prospectus for UG-CBCS effective from 2021-22

The final prospectus has been uploaded on both the NSOU website and admission portal. The closing date was 26/10/2021. It was also reported that two Virtual Orientation Programmes for Coordinators of LSCs were organized (on 12/8/2021 and 13/8/2021) to facilitate the new admission of UG-CBCS.

### 11. To consider the “Intra University Credit Transfer Policy”

Since the proposal has been approved, the learners may avail this facility through application under CBCS too.

### 12. To finalize the certificate for Course Work of NSOU Ph.D.

The design and content of the completion certificate for Course Work of Ph.D. has been finalized and forwarded to the respective School of Studies. The School of Studies may get it printed from the designated printer as per requirements.

It was reported that due to unavoidable circumstances, the admission into Ph.D. programme in ELT for 2020-21 has been postponed.

### 13. To consider the introduction of new syllabus from 2021-22 (January 2022) session: i) PG-ELT, ii) M.Com. and iii) MSW

The new SLMs for 1<sup>st</sup> year are ready for printing to launch the new syllabus of the stated programmes.

### 14. To publish the CBCS-SLM in local Language i.e. Bengali version

School of Professional Studies: All the SLMs of HCO (Commerce) and HEC (Economics) are available in Bengali version.

School of Sciences: All the SLMs of the CC papers of Botany (HBT) and compulsory AECC-2 (ENVS) are available in Bengali version. The Director informed that on the basis of demand, the SLMs may be prepared in Bengali version.

School of Social Sciences: CC-HI-01 & CC-HI-04 are available in Bengali version. The Director informed that on receipt of final version of History-SLMs, he may take initiatives to translate the same.

School of Education: The director informed that the Bengali version of all SLMs of 1<sup>st</sup> year are expected to receive in the first week of December 2021.

It was also discussed that hand outs for each unit may be developed by the faculties and be uploaded on the LMS. The SLMs of old syllabus may be used for this purpose.

### 15. To consider the printing of CBCS-SLM and uploading on the NSOU website

## CONCEPT NOTE

### e-Tutoring and e-Mentoring

#### **Introduction**

With the onset of Covid-19 pandemic and closure of Academic Institution for prolonged period, NSOU had already taken up online activities like E-mentoring and E-Counselling (other than regular online classes across all its programmes), though not in a formal structure. It has been reported informally and have been witnessed many times that faculty members have extended their support towards creating such effective mechanism to ensure better learning opportunities in these trying times. Keeping the benchmark of quality in a more structured manner and also recording it as some of the best practices, these initiatives may be introduced formally with a well-knitted modality.

#### **Rationale**

##### e-Tutoring

The impact and efficacy of e-Tutoring offered by an Open and Distance Learning (ODL) institution to its heterogeneous learners mainly focuses on learners' awareness of the educational services provided by the University through its different stakeholders (Teachers, LSC, Coordinators, Staff etc.) based, in the context of academic admissions and support, teaching-learning-evaluation process, career indecision, financial and psychosocial challenges. The more recent emphasis on online distance learning encompasses, *inter alia*, electronic counseling as an important adjunct to the uninterrupted and outcome-based learning process.

##### e-Mentoring

Mentoring is widely acknowledged as an effective method for professional and academic development. The advances in the area of Information Technologies have positively impacted the mentoring process through a more technology-mediated form of mentoring known as e-mentoring or online mentoring. This form of mentoring has particularly had a great impact in improving learning opportunities in the context of online communities where teachers and learners from around the world interact with each other in a mutually beneficial collaboration and learning experience.

**Proposed Aim:** NSOU may extend this service of e-Tutoring and e-Mentoring to facilitate the above-mentioned challenges and generate better educational opportunities.

**Scope:** These drives may be introduced for PG Programmes on MSW, PGED, PGELT, M.Sc. in Zoology and Geography, B.Ed.(Spl. Education), .....

**Mode:** Counselling/Mentoring/Tutorial sessions on virtual platform (ICT support) with representation from stakeholders mainly University Faculties. These may be organised and operated Programme-wise/RC-wise with a proper event schedule and circulated in consultation with the concerned academic departments under respective Schools of Studies.

**Significance:** Information and Communication Technology (ICT) has a critical role to play within the open and distance learning (ODL) environment, helping to minimize the detachment between teachers, student support structures, students, LSCs, partnering institutes and the University. It covers and ensures:

- ii) AICTE (Open and Distance Learning Education and Online Education) Guidelines, 2021

In view of the above, the School proposes to launch 2-Year MBA programme on self financed mode (Session 2022-23) subject to approval of AICTE and UGC.
