- 10. To consider the matter of adoption of the PBAS format for Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) for teachers holding substantive posts of the University as per University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) (4th Amendment), Regulations, 2016.
- 11. To consider matters related to recognition of the University Grants Commission (UGC) under section 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956.

Agenda Note: (a) UGC-DEB (vide their F.No. DEB/ SOU/ Dev.Gr./2014-15; 05/06/2015 read with F.No. 14-1/2016 (DEB-IV); 14/09/2016) urged the SoUs to complete the formalities for 12B status of UGC by the end F.Y. 2015-16 failing which the Development grant of GoI would be discontinued. Accordingly, the UGC was approached (vide Memo No. VC/ 861; Dt. 24/06/2015) to allow 5 yrs. preparation time for acquiring the 12B Status under UGC. It was urged further to continue the disbursement of UGC-DEB grants to the SoUs during the transitory period. (b) Simultaneously, the H.E. Deptt. was approached (vide Memo Nos VC/943, Dt.10/7/2015; VC/11/225, Dt 28.12.2016) for creation of requisite number of teaching posts as per UGC's stipulations for achieving 12B status under UGC Act, 1956. (c) It is also to be noted that UGC-DEB is in the process of prescribing a separate set of stipulations / format for recognition of the SoUs).

12. To report on the status/development of the Newtown -Rajarhat Campus of NSOU.

Agenda Note: To meet extreme scarcity of space at Kolkata, nearly three (3) acres of land at Newtown, Kolkata was purchased on leasehold basis from WBHIDCO in order to establish an Integrated Open Campus Cum Regional centre of NSOU under the Principal Head "Education". The university is already in receipt of Rs. 1.48 Crore of construction of boundary wall from the H.E. Deptt., GoWB and the process of construction of the same is now going on by the PWD, GoWB. Simultaneously, in the first phase the University has proposed setting up of a G+5 storied building with total built up area of 12,336 sq.m and this project would be implemented by PWD, GoWB. Accordingly, the rough cost estimate has been sent to the Higher Education Deptt. for issuance of Administrative Approval for the project. On receipt of necessary administrative approval and allotment of necessary fund as per the total projected cost, the construction of a G+5 storied building in the First Phase with essential supporting structure and allied works can be undertaken so that academic activities in the Campus may be initiated as soon as practicable.

13. To report setting up of Regional Centres (RC) at Jalpaiguri and at Durgapur respectively on 2.87 and 5.0 acres of land. RCs at both these places are almost ready and once handed over the university



may start operation at these centres. Be it noted that 13- posts of Officers and Non-Teaching staff (NTS) has been created by the HE Deptt, GoWB (vide Memo No 464-Edn (U)/1U (NS)-12/16, dt 04.05.2017 and No. 897-Edn (U)/1U (NS)-11/16; Dt.09/08/2017) for the Jalpaiguri RC and the Durgapur RC. Some of these posts have already been advertised after due approval of ROA by the BCW Dept.

ACADEMIC ISSUES

- 14. It is to be noted that the UGC Open and Distance Learning Regulations, 2017 notified in the Gazette of India on 23.06.2017 stipulates that the Universities should apply for approval/recognition for starting new courses/programmes for the next academic session as per UGC notification vide No. 74-4/2017 (DEB-4) dt 29.06.2017. Placed for approval of EC.
- 15. To consider the adaptation/execution of DEB-UGC approval [Ref. F.No-2-1/2017(DEB-III/DEB-IV); Dt. 19.05.2017] regarding M.Phil. / Ph.D. course at NSOU in regular mode as per UGC (minimum standards and procedures of award of M.Phil. /Ph.D. degrees) Regulations, 2016. Be it noted that the preparation of a draft Regulation is under the process, which may be sent to the competent authority with the approval of the E.C.
- 16. To consider introduction of Post Graduate courses in regular mode, preferably, for the following lab-based science subjects in view of the increasing demand of higher studies: i) Botany; ii) Chemistry & iii) Scientific Computing.
- 17. To consider the matter of implementation of revised syllabi under CBCS in NSOU as recommended by UGC and WBSCHE (for courses run in F2F mode).
- 18. To consider implementation of the following criteria for admission to different laboratory based subjects in BDP & PG level under the aegis of School of Sciences, NSOU in order to maintain the quality of teaching with limited laboratory resources from **July 2018** session onwards and to cope with increasing student enrolment in the following programmes:
 - Honours Graduate (10+2+3) in Mathematics for **PGMT** (same as existing criteria of PGGR & PGZO)
 - ii) Passed 10+2 exam. or equivalent with 50% marks in Mathematics for EMT (i.e Hons. In Maths.)
 - iii) Passed 10+2 exam. or equivalent with 55% marks in Geography for EGR (i.e. Hons. In Geogr.)
 - iv) Passed 10+2 exam. or equivalent with 50% marks in Biology for EZO (i.e. Hons. In Zool.)
- 19. To consider the proposal of introduction of BA in Education (in ODL mode) under the aegis of School of Education from the 2018-19 academic session.
- 20. To consider to introduce Post Graduate Course in Sociology (PGSO). Be it noted, that the School has already taken initiative to prepare the syllabus following the latest UGC Guideline. Once the syllabus is finalized, Self-learning Materials (SLMs) will be developed and formal approval of UGC will be sought. The School is currently offering BDP in Sociology (ESO).
- 21. To consider implementation of a revised course structure/ syllabus of BDP-ECO (B.Com) which may be effective from the academic session 2018-19.
- 22. To consider implementation of a revised course structure/ syllabus and thorough revision of the course materials of Post Graduate Degree in Commerce (M.Com) w.e.f. 2018-19 session.



- 23. To consider the proposal of introduction of Bachelor in Social Work (BSW) w.e.f 2018-19 session under the aegis of School of Professional Studies (SPS).
- 24. To consider the proposal of introduction of MBA w.e.f. 2018-19 session under the aegis of School of Professional Studies (SPS).
- 25. To consider the grafting facility for vocational courses as is given to UG/PG courses.
- 26. To consider the re-introduction of PG Diploma in Yoga Education (2-year) w.e.f. July 2018 session (revising the nomenclature of PG Diploma in Sports and Competitive Yoga).
- 27. To consider the introduction of Post Graduate Diploma in Non-Profit Organization and Social. Entrepreneurship Management on SWAYAM/ SWAYAM PRABHA, MHRD, Gol; the assignment part (20%) will be through MOOCs) w.e.f 2018-19 session.
- 28. To consider the launching of following vocational courses under School of Vocational Studies w.e.f 2018-19: (a) One Year Advance Diploma in Cosmetology, (b) Diploma & Advance Diploma in Make-Up, Beauty & Hair (6 months each).
- 29. To report about the Ph.D. candidates who have successfully completed the course and provisionally been awarded the degree (vide Annexure-III) as per pre- 2009 Regulations of UGC. The following candidates who have successfully completed the final Viva-Voce test and have been recommended by the duly constituted board for degree of award (till date).
- 30. To report the revision of course structure of MLIS with compulsory paper on Research Methodology w.e.f. 2016-17 session.
- 31. To report the launching of Short-term Training Programme (STP) w.e.f. 2016-17 under School of Professional Studies at Kalyani campus viz: i) Women Studies (3-month), ii) Child Rights & Protection (3-month), iii) Library Information Technology (6-month), iv) Library Automation and Networking (3-month), v) Computerized Accounting system (3-month).
- 32. To report that A Certificate Course on "Capacity Building and Professional Development of Teacher Educators for Successful Implementation of Inclusiveness" will be introduced soon in joint collaboration between Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia(CEMCA) and NSOU. The SLM package and Audio-visual content has already been prepared.
- 33. To report the adoption of OER policy w.e.f. 2016-17 session with revised licensing policy (CC-BY-NC-SA) for the university publications in respect of ICT enabled courses.
- 34. To report the development of NSOU OER Repository with the help of Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (CEMCA-COL) (_________)

- c. Shri Tapas Das retired on 31.12.2014 as Assistant Librarian Gr II. He was elevated from Library Assistant to Assistant Librarian Gr II (vide G.O No. 4-Edn (U)/1U-59/99 dated 01.01.2008). From this G.O it appeared that the position held by Shri Das was personal to him and thus this post may now be transformed to the initial one.
- d. The "second "post of Assistant Librarian Gr II was created by G.O. No.137-Edn (U) /EH/1U (NS)-03/10, dated, 25th February 2011.



- e. Till then processing of applications of these two posts have been kept in hold.
- f. It is proposed to cancel the said advertisement and to refund the application fees to all the applicants to the said two posts in order to avoid any possible litigation
- 46. To consider the delegation of administrative power to the Director, Regional Centre for the smooth functioning of the Regional Centres [vide NSOU First Statutes(Revised),2014-Clause13(5)(c)(xviii)]

Agenda Note: For Setting up of Regional Centres(RC) at Jalpaiguri on a piece of land measuring 2.87 acre and at Durgapur on a piece of land measuring 5 acre, the University approached the chief engineer, social sector P.W Directorate Govt. of W.B. to prepare the project estimate and to execute the construction work. The proposal was accepted by the Chief Engineer social sector P.W Directorate. Both the project estimates received Administrative Approval of the Higher Education Deptt by the middle of July 2014. The Social Sector P.W. Directorate soon took up the implementation of both the project work. Some members of the Building Committee formed by the University as per statute, visited the sites of both Durgapur and Jalpaiguri in the month of November'15. The progress of work of both the places appear satisfactory. It is expected that the construction of Faculty Building, Administrative Building and Guest House at Jalpaiguri and at Durgapur will be completed by the middle of this calendar year 2016.

A piece and parcel of land at New Town, Kolkata was received by the university measuring three(3) acres, from HIDCO for establishing a regional centre and open campus of NSOU under the principal use "education". The agreement of deed was signed on 14.10.2015. Recently it has been informed by the Higher Education (HE) Deptt that the stamp duty and Registration fees chargeable on the execution of Lease Deed in respect to this land has been remitted.]

To prepare a project report for setting up of a centralized campus at New Town an expert committee has been formed as per recommendation of the Building Committee. A meeting of this committee was held on 22.02.2016 in the chamber of Vice-Chancellor, NSOU. At the outset the Vice Chancellor apprised the members the objective of forming a committee of experts to advice about the steps to be taken for the proposed construction of a regional centre and open campus at New Town. The committee looked into the list of state bodies and corporations as per rule 47D of FD5400-F(Y); dated 25.06.2012 as forwarded and advised by the Higher Education Department. Competence and limitations of the bodies and corporations to do all the functions like PWD was also briefly discussed. The committee felt that for assigning the work to Public Works Dept. or other bodies, a proper concept

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document with general arrangement needs to be prepared first—to enter into an agreement/MoU. Since the University is not having any set up to prepare a proper technical concept document, it was felt that services of a competent consultant may be availed in this regard.

Reported and noted

19. To consider a report on the functioning of the Kalyani, Campus.

All the Schools of Studies have been allotted adequate space in the Kalyani Campus to conduct their diverse academic programmes. Most of the Schools have been provided financial assistance to develop infrastructural facilities to set up smart classes, laboratories, PCP(Personal Contact Program) arrangements with full ICT support in addition to SLMs (Self Learning materials). An audio visual (AV) studio is also to be set up soon to cater to the needs of the students.] Space has been allotted for organising activities of the Central Library of the University at Kalyani campus, under the control of Deputy Librarian. Total area measuring about 2194sqft(approx) on the second floor of the newly constructed three storied warehouse building at Kalyani Campus has been allotted for this purpose.

20. To consider the matter regarding the 14-Non-Teaching employees (Annexure-F)

Reported and deliberated by the House; and it was resolved that the matter be taken up with the Higher Education Dept, Govt of West Bengal, for sympathetic consideration at their end.

21. To report on the on-going litigation [SLP (C) 8497-98 of 2015 & SLP (C) of 13663 of 2015] at the Supreme Court of India regarding validity of NSOU's Ph.D. Degree.

Agenda Note- Order dated 24.12.2014 of arising out of MAT 1068 of 2014 with CAN 9459 of 2014 relating to the case of Dr Abdul Motin —vs- Dr Manisankar Maity. In the proceedings of the aforesaid litigation in the Division Bench of High Court, Calcutta the Ph D degree of NSOU was mentioned as "substandard and not up to the mark". Not only that all the degrees in comparison to its equivalent counter-parts of regular university has been stated as substandard. The matter is now pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and NSOU is one of the defendants.

22. To report the Court case regarding the post of Co-ordinator, B.Ed. (SEDE)-R.V.W No 84 of 2015 & CAN 3744 of 2015 (A.Panigrahi Vs NSOU & Others).

Agenda Note- As per the last communication from the Advocate of Shri Partha Sen that after hearing the parties High Court, Calcutta has dismissed the above stated Review Application. And at the same time Advocate of Shri Panigrahi intimated the University that very soon they are going to file SLP at Hon'ble Supreme Court and advised the University "to refrain from going ahead with any immediate appointment for the aforesaid post in favour of Sri Patha Sen or anyone else". It is pertinent to mention that the Process of Selection for the Post of Co-ordinator B.Ed (SEDE) was held on 16.07.2010. Selection committee made a single member panel consisting of Shri Partha Sen. But before issuance of appointment letter to Shri Sen, Shri Abhedananda Panigrahi (one of the candidates) challenged the selection of Shri Sen in the court of law on the ground that Shri Sen was having inadequate experience at that material point of time.

Reference for discussion- The process of selection of candidate for the post of Co-ordinator, B.Ed (SEDE) was held on 16.07.2010 and nearly four and a half years have lapsed as it was held up in the courts of law (both High Court and Supreme Court. No appointment letter has been issued till date. The present E.C was constituted in 2012 and the aforesaid selection process has never been reflected in any deliberation(s) of the present EC. Meanwhile as per latest RCI stipulations the B.Ed-ODL(SEDE) course structure and contents have been thoroughly revised.

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Reported and the House opined that the matter be taken up with a legal practitioner for advice in this regard.

23. To propose a suitable date and venue for holding of 10th annual convocation of the University for approval by the Hon'ble Chancellor.

Resolved that the Vice-Chancellor be empowered to finalise the Date and Venue of the Convocation under the advice of the Hon'ble Chancellor, NSOU.

24. To authorise the Vice-Chancellor to implement different orders as may be issued by the Govt. of West Bengal for the University from time to time in connection with service conditions such as promotion, leave rules, CAS etc for Teachers, Officers and Non-Teaching employees.

MINUTES OF THE 31st MEETING OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE HELD ON 7th NOVEMBER, 2016 AT 11.00 AM IN THE BOARD ROOM OF THE UNIVERSITY

All the seven members of the Finance Committee were present in the meeting held under the Chairmanship of Prof. S. S. Sarkar, the Vice-Chancellor of NSOU. At the beginning the Vice Chancellor requested the Finance Officer to proceed with the discussion agenda wise. Likewise record of the discussions have been noted below.

1. Confirmation of the Minutes of 30th Finance Committee Meeting held on 19th Jan. 2016:

The Minutes of 30th F.C. meeting was read out by the Finance Officer and was confirmed with minor change in Cl. No. 2(iii) by way of inclusion of "for members residing outside WB" by the House & endorsed by the Vice Chancellor.

2. Placement of Budget for the FY 2017-18:

The Budget for the Financial Year 2017-18 placed by the Finance Officer before the members had been discussed and accepted by the house.

3. Post Facto approval of contractual appointment of Shri Sudipta Panda. Advocate as a Retainer:

The Vice-Chancellor had appraised the house for the necessity of a Legal retainer and briefed about the engagement of Sri Sudipta Panda, Ld. Advocate on Part-time basis at a lump-sum monthly remuneration of Rs. 10,000/- only for looking after the legal matters and to advise the University authority regarding legal issues from time to time. The house had ratified the part-time engagement of Sri Panda.

4. (A) Consideration of Rationalization / Enhancement of Remuneration of Contractual employees:

The Vice-Chancellor informed the house that the remuneration of the 18 contractual staff was revised last time in the year 2013 and partially in 2014. He proposed to revise the remuneration of said staff on case to case basis considering the length of engagement in NSOU and qualifications / experience of the respective staff. The Finance officer placed the list of staff below with the proposed revised remuneration for consideration of the house.

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The house considered the proposed revised remuneration as depicted above and advised to give effect to the revised remuneration from 1st November, 2016.

- 4. (B)The prayers of (i) Sri Gurudas Biswas, Office Assistant at Kalyani Regional Centre/Campus, for enhancement of remuneration was actively considered. The House resolved that the remuneration of Sri Biswas would be payable from 1st November, 2016 at a rate as notified in the Circular(s) issued by the Labour Dept., Govt. of WB from time to time; (ii) Sri Rupesh Bansfore, Part-time Sweeper was also discussed and his revised wages would also be effective from 1st November, 2016 at a fixed monthly remuneration of Rs.5000/- only.
- 5. Consideration of Duplicate Bills of Seva Mudran of 2009 for payment of arrear dues:

 The Finance Officer appraised the House that the total claim amounting to Rs.4,09,253/ was submitted by the vendor on 16.05.2011. Out of this Rs. 203039 was paid on the basis of original documents submitted to the Fin. Dept. The balance amount of Rs.2,06,214/ could not be paid due to non-receipt of original Bills, Challan, Work Order and in the absence of Stock Entry Certificate. The matter was discussed in the house and it was resolved that at present payment could not be made on the basis of the documents submitted in the house by the Fin. Dept.
- 6. Matters related to enhancement of Course Fees of BDP & PG Courses including Renewal thereof:

 The |Finance Officer reported that the Admission Fees and other related Fees for BDP and PG Courses were previously approved by the FC in the academic session 2015-16 and subsequently ratified by EC. The said Fees for BDP Courses were not yet implemented considering the overall situation at the time of admission. The Revised and approved Admission Fees for PG courses was given effective from the Academic Session 2016-17. The approved Renewal Fees for BDP and PG @ Rs. 600/ for renewal in each year would also be applicable from the Academic Session 2017-18. The Finance Officer reported that the Dept. of the Registrar had to usually re-open the process of Renewal every year and the re-opening of the process of Renewal would also involve cost relating to the online activities. In view of the extra cost and hazard the Dept. of Registrar suggested to impose late fee @ Rs. 200/ per candidate for BDP and PG courses. The house unanimously endorsed the imposition of the late fee of Rs. 200/ per candidate in case of re-opening of Renewal from the academic session 2017-18.
- 7. Matter of Revision and introduction of TA. DA & Halting Charges for University employees:
 The Finance Officer proposed a draft showing revised rates of TA, DA & Halting Charges in and outside West Bengal for different categories of employees of NSOU as follows.

All the above proposals of enhancement of TA, DA and Halting charges have been approved by the FC and the Committee recommended to give immediate effect.

Enhancement of Financial support to the Study Centres for PG & BDP Courses:

The Director, Study Centre of NSOU, informed the house that the work load of each Study Centre has been increased due to admission of nearly 43,000 students (from nearly 36,000 in 2015-16) in BDP in the Academic Session 2016-17 for which Study Centres have been claiming financial support. The Director suggested to pay one-time financial support of Rs. 300/ per student for the excess no. of students admitted in 2016-17 as compared to last year 2015-16. He also reiterated that the existing grant of Rs. 300/ per student for PG courses was being continued for long time. He proposed to increase the Financial Grant for PG Courses from Rs. 300/ to Rs. 500/ per student from the Academic Session 2016-17. Be it noted that no other financial support with regard to maintenance is granted to the study centres for PG courses.

The house considered the proposal of BDP and PG courses and resolved to give one-time financial support to excess no. of students of BDP admitted in 2016-17 Academic Session as compared to no. of students admitted in 2015-16 @ Rs. 300/ per student and endorsed the increased rate of financial support @ Rs. 500/ per student for PG courses from Academic Session 2016-17 and onwards.

- Enhancement of Overtime Allowances for staff of COE's Dept:
 - The term-end examinations of BDP and PG courses are being held now at a time and the Examination Dept. is basically run with the engagement of agency staff. During the period of examination spread over 4/5 months the Office of the COE is usually remain open on Saturday & Sunday. The wage of the said staff is disbursed at a rate announced by Circular of Labour Dept. from time to time. The rate of wages of agency staff in holidays is double the normal rate. In view of this situation the COE proposed to enhance the existing ceiling limit of OT Allowance of Rs. 2,500/ to Rs. 3,000/. The house unanimously approved the enhanced ceiling limit from Rs. 2,500/ to Rs. 3,000/ with effect from 1st September,
- 10. Rationalization of usage of Car in Administrative / Academic Deptts/ Schools:

 The Vice-Chancellor has appraised the house that the head of the Dept. or School was provided with a car for official purpose in general. He pointed out that two cars were provided to School of Education in consideration of outside official work when the School was in charge of training of nearly 29,000 upper primary teachers who were allotted by the Dept. of School, GOWB under B. Ed ODL courses during the Academic Session 2013-15 for two years on project mode. The School had successfully completed the said B. Ed ODL Course on project mode on 31st march, 2015. Now, the SOE is running only RCI approved B. Ed Special Education Course having intake capacity of 480 students in 11 Study Centres. In consideration of fact as above it was resolved that only one car would be provided to the SOE with effect from 1st December, 2016 to maintain parity with other Dept. / School in regard to the usage of car. The proposal was approved by
- 11. Matter of rationalization of pay of Shri Asim Kr. Nath, PA to VC:

The Finance Officer reported the House that the Pay in the Pay Band & the Grade Pay of Shri Asim Kr. Nath, Stenographer & P.A. to Vice Chancellor are at present respectably Rs. 20,500/- &Rs. 4,400/-, which is less than the Grade Pay of Rs. 4,600/- of two other Stenographers junior to Shri Nath. The Vice Chancellor suggested to rationalize the Grade Pay & Pay in the Pay Band of Shri Nath as per rules of fixation of pay. The House resolved that the Grade Pay of Shri Nath would be stepped up to Rs. 4,600/- equal to the Grade pay of other two stenographers and the pay in the pay band of Rs. 9,000/- - 28,300/- would be notionally fixed at Rs. 20,300/- following the existing rules of Fixation of Pay.

12. Matter regarding Payment of Outstanding TDS Demand Notice. Gol. Dt. 27/10/2016:

A demand notice having Memo No. ITO.Wd-3(1) TDS/KOL/16-17/Demand/588 dated Nil was received by the University on 27/10/2016. The University authority was requested to pay a demand of Rs.37,45,450/- within 7 days from the date of receipt of this letter. Otherwise action may be taken in terms of Sec. 221 - 226 and 276B/26BB. In view of this, the Finance Officer was advised to pay at first the demand of TDS accordingly and then to proceed for filing the Correction Statement at the earliest.

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- 13. Placement of Report about the non-implementation of Fin. Dept. G.O. No.1107-F(P) dt. 25/02/2016:

 The Finance Officer reported that the Higher Education Dept. in response to our query, clarified that the G.O. No. 1107-F(P) dated 25.02.2016 was not applicable to the employees of the State-aided Universities. The house advised the University authority to follow the guidelines of the said G. O. strictly.
- 14. Consideration of same TA /DA for paper setters/moderators/examiners/scrutinizers:

 The TA at the rate of Rs.150/- is applicable for paper setters/moderators/examiners/scrutinizers henceforth. DA is not applicable for paper setters/moderators/examiners/scrutinizers henceforth.
- 15. Report of Activation of E-Store in association with Schoolguru Eduserve Pvt. Ltd.:

 The report of Finance Officer that the publications of the University other than SLMs are made available for purchase through e-store at listed price on the University portal through Schoolguru who will be allowed @ 25% of the sale proceeds as commission was endorsed by the F. C.
- 16. Consideration of Enhancement of monthly Contingency of COE Dept.from Rs. 30.000/ to Rs. 40.000/:
 On 20.03.2014 the COE requested the Vice-Chancellor to increase the monthly contingency from Rs.30000/- to
 Rs.40000/- p.m. to meet the increased expenditure due to escalation of prices of various articles used in the said Dept. and
 increased workload. The proposal was approved by the Vice-Chancellor on that day, but the Finance Officer was
 continuously providing monthly advance at the rate of Rs. 30,000/-. The house ratified unanimously the approved rate of
 monthly contingency of Rs.40000/- by the Vice-Chancellor and requested the Finance Officer to disburse the monthly
 advance accordingly.

17. Miscellaneous matters with the permission of the Chair:

- <u>Creation of Corpus Fund:</u> The Vice-Chancellor has reported that there is no welfare fund for the employees of the University so as to provide financial support to employees in case of terminal diseases etc. He also proposed to create a Welfare Fund for the employees for the purpose stated above. The house requested the Vice-Chancellor to form a committee to look after the issue and submit a comprehensive report for the formation of Corpus Fund for the employees of the University along with the objectives of the Corpus Fund and manner of utilization to the next Finance Committee Meeting.
- Sri Debasish Dutta, member of FC, nominated by H.E. Dept. requested the Finance Officer to report the present status of the Annual Accounts of the University. In reply, the Finance Officer stated that:

 a) The recording of transactions in the books of accounts is simultaneous with the preparation of youchers.
 - b) The Bank Reconciliation has been updated up to 31.03.2014 from 16.08.1997
 - c) The Bank Reconciliation would be completed within 30.11.2016
 - d) Finalization of accounts will take another 3-4 months after completion of BRS.
- The Finance Officer was requested to complete the finalization of accounts up to 31.03.2017 and subsequently to make the Balance Sheet Audit of the University by a firm of Chartered Accountants selected as per norms of the University.

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Minutes of the 32nd Meeting of the Finance Committee was held on 28th June, 2017 (Wednesday) at 02,00 pm in the Board Room of the University.

Out of eight members of the Finance Committee seven members were present in the moeting held under the Chairmanship of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. At the beginning the Vice Chancellor requested the Finance Officer to proceed with the discussion agenda wise. Likewise record of the discussions has been noted below.

- Confirmation of the Minutes of 31st Finance Committee Meeting held on 7st November, 2015;
 The Minutes of 31st F.C. meeting was read out by the Finance Officer and was confirmed by the House & endorsed by the Vice Chancellor.
- Placement of Annual Budget for the Financial Year 2018-2019;
 The Budget for the financial year 2017-18 placed by the Finance Officer before the members had been discussed and passed by the House.
- 3. Reporting about CAG Audit held for 2014-16 and Feed Back of reply of Audit Paras from 1997-2014; Transaction Audit of the University for the period from 01-04-2014 to 31-03-2016 had been conducted by Local Audit Department. Office of the Principal Accountant General (G & SSA). West Bengal (starting from 03-03-2017 & concluded on 13-04-2017). Replies to all the 29 Audit Recuisitions issued by the aforesaid team during the conduction of Audit had been given.

The CAG Audit of this University for the first time since its inception – covering the period from 1997 to 2012 had raised 23 Audit Paras. Out of that 16 Audit Paras had been dropped by CAG vide their 146 s-III/Audit/BSR/23(72)/6190 dated 30-03-2016.

The Second CAG Audit of the University for the period 2012-2014 hed issued 19 Audit Paras, but of which 7 Audit Paras had been settled by CAG vide their No. SS-III Audit/BSR/5040 dated 30-93-2017.

The Audit Paras for the financial year 01-04-2014 to 31-03-2016 are yet to be received.

4. Procurement of Fund for Construction of Administrative and Academic Building at New Town: The University purchased a plot of land measuring three acres at Newtown in 2014 allotted by WBHIDCO at a cost of Rs. 14.97.00.000/- with the approval of HE Dept. GoWB with a view to ostablish the Administrative – Academic Block Comprising Class Rooms. Laboratory. Stores. Library. Auditorium. Conference Room. Cafeteria, Guest Rooms etc. An amount of Rs.1.48.46.186/- has been received from the Higher Education Dept. for construction of boundary wall of the said land and PWD is already in the process of its construction.

The estimated cost of construction of the G+7 storied Administrative – Academic Block having covered area to the tune of 178000 Sq. ft. may come up to about Rs.60 Crore. In consideration of urgency, initially up to G-5 floors of the said building block having about 110000 sq. ft. covered area necessary action shall be initiated ASAP to submit the proposal along with DPR before HE Dept. GoWB for necessary approval and sanction of Rs. 50 Crore in the 1st phase. In reply to a query by the Hon'ble VC about availability of fund from the University's

lown source for utilization in case of necessity in the said construction, the Finance Officer has reported that emergency fund may be made available for the said work from University's Own Source to the tune of about Rs. 20 Ordre for which normal activities of the University may not be affected for conting next 10 - 15 years.

5. Finalization of Annual Accounts from 1997-2017:

The finalization of Annual Accounts of the University was a long pending issue. At present the finalization of Account from 1997 to 2006 has been completed. The preparation of Final Accounts for the period from 01-04-2008 to 31-03-2017 is in preparase and is expected to be completed by January, 2018.

6. Feed Back regarding Payment of Outstanding TDS Demand Rs.37.45.450/-:

The outstanding TDS demand of Rs. 37,45,450+ having demand under 29Q Rs.7.39.3004 for the year 2012-13 to 2015-16 and under 24Q Rs.2.00.960/ for the FY 2013-14 & 2014-15 was placed in the 31st FC Meeting. The Finance Officer was advised to pay the said demand first and then to take necessary steps for rectification of earlier returns as per Rules.

An initiative has been taken by the Finance Dept. to rectify the earlier TDS Returns through submission of Revised Returns as per Rules for the FY 2012 to 2016 to reduce the TDS Demand. The out of the initiative is summarized below:

The Finance Department has requested the Income Tax Authority vide this office Memo, No.AC/258/16-17 dated 23-12-2016 to transfer the said amount of Rs. 6.77461/- from PAN to TAN of the University of an early date. The O/S TDS Demand of Rs. 8,12,799/- would also be reduced on successful transfer of Rs. 6,77,461/- from Pan to TAM because of interest behalty factor included in the said demand. The final TDS Demand could be made by the University only when the IT Authority would be kind to make adjustment of transferrable amount of Rs. 6,77,461-, interest and penalty, if any.

7. Feed Back regarding Creation of Corpus Fund:

The Registrar placed a detail proposal for creation of Corpus Fund to assist the employees of the University, financially in case of treatment of terminal diseases. After discussion on this matter it was decided that a corpus fund of Rs.5.00.000/- (Ruppes Five Eaklis) would be created for this purpose initially from the current financial year and following stipulations procedures are to be observed for maintenance and disbursement of the said fund.

- The financial assistance may be granted only for the patient of Carolnoma Deing a terminal disease.
- ii) The application for financial assistance should be made to the Vice-Chancellor.
- The Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Registrar and Finance Officer will sanction financial assistance. The amount of assistance will be determined by the Vice-Chancellor on case to case basis subject to a maximum of Rs.1.00.000:- Rupeos One Lakh only) per head in a financial year.
- (N) An employee may apply for financial assistance from Corpus Fund only once in a financial year
- An employee opting for the Medical Insurance facility with the university contribution as a subsidy is not entitled to apply for this financial assistance from this Corpus fund.
- vi) In case of pariety of available fund, the Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to decide orionty if there is multiple number of applications pending at any point of time.
- Finance Officer will be in-charge of the said Fund.
- viii' Final dispursement will be made through University Accounts.

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- 3. Remuneration for discharging additional charge of Controller of Exams, by Deputy Registrar (Exam.): Smt. Rokeye Ray, Deputy Registrar (Exam.), has submitted a prayer for additional remuneration for shouldering additional charge of Controller of Examinations. The matter was discussed and the House could not take a decision regarding in her matter in the absence of any provision to pay additional remuneration and therefore, it was decided to send it to the HE Dept. for their views/necessary action on this issue.
- 9. Late Fee for Renewal of Studentship & Fees for Revision of Entries in Enrolment Certificate: Online Annual renewal of studentship is being kept open during a certain period every year and these are culy advertises through Wiehsite and study Centers. The Registrar has reported that every year there are numbers of requests/applications received after exprity of renewal cate, it was decided that a sum of Rs. 200/- would be charged as Late Fee for extension of the period of Renewal to recover partly the cost involved in re-opening the online system of Renewal Process.

The Registrar has also reported that a system of correction of enrolment data of the students is in vogue in the University and it involves gost and time, it was decided that a supplementary Fee of Rs. 200, - would be imposed to recover a part of cost for any type of modification and correction request in student's enrolment certificate.

10. Medical Insurance Policy for retired NSOU employees:

The Registrar has reported that the employees against substantive posts opting to some under the Medical insurance Policy used to get a subsidy in the form of a monthly premium of Rs. 300/-by the University. He has proposed to extent the same benefit to the retired employees (who were appointed substantive basis) of the University with effect from 01-08-2017. The House has passed the proposal for due execution of extending the Medical Insurance facility accordingly to the retired employees receiving pension.

- 11. Miscellaneous Matters with the Permission of the Chair:
 - (a) AMC Arrangement for Fire Pump. Generator and Electrical Installations at all the Premises of the University:

The Registrar has reported that at present various sophisticated Fire Pump, Generator. Electrical Equipments have been installed in different location/premises/campuses of the University including Headquarters at Salt Lake. There is no in-house engineering division to look after all these machineries and installations in case of broak down and to get repaired. He, in this respect, has proposed that an agency may be engaged to take up the work. He also suggested that as most of the installations/buildings have been completed with the services of FWD, Govt, of West Bengal, we may request PWD to provide us the services of AMC for Fire Pump. Generator and other Electric Installations. The House has approved the proposal unanimously.

(b) Joining of Director, Regional Centre, and Delegation of Financial Power of Regional Centre, Kalyani to the New Director:

The Registrar has informed the House that Dr. Nirupama Ehattacharya Goswami has joined as Director. Regional Centre. Kalyani, She has taken over the Charge of the Regional Centre. Kalyani, and Prof. Debharayan Modak has been relieved from his additional charge to act as in –charge. Kalyani Campus, in this situation it was decided by the House that Dr. Nirupama Bhattacharya Goswami will operate the Bank Account of Regional Centre, Kalyani, in place of Dr. Dehnarayan Modak henceforth.

(c) Acceptance of Past Service:

The Registrar has reported that Officers. Faculties and other employees of the University use to get the continuity of past services benefits in terms of the relevant rules/ norms of the Government and / or the University from time to time, it has been noted that such benefits were extended, infavour of Dr. Dep Narayan Modak, Professor of Pol. Science, Dr. Ashit Baran Alch, Director, Study Centres etc. The same benefits have been extended to Prof. Subha Sankar Sarkar, Vice-Chancellor, NSOU, since retired from the

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GRAB Service on 314 December, 2015, as per rules/ norms of the University, read with the G.O. of Higher Edn. Deptt., GoWB issued vide its Memo No. 98-Edu(U) 1NSOU -2/16; Dt. 94-91/2017. Accordingly, the matter has been noted.

The meeting ended with sincere vote of thanks to the Chair.

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Reference for discussion- The process of selection of candidate for the post of Co-ordinator, B.Ed (SEDE) was held on 16.07.2010 and nearly four and a half years have lapsed as it was held up in the courts of law (both High Court and Supreme Court. No appointment letter has been issued till date. Meanwhile as per latest RCI stipulations the B.Ed-ODL(SEDE) course structure and contents have been thoroughly revised.

To report on the on-going litigation [SLP (C) 8497-98 of 2015 & SLP (C) of 13663 of 2015] at the Supreme Court of India regarding validity of NSOU's Ph.D. Degree.

Note-Order dated 24.12.2014 of arising out of MAT 1068 of 2014 with CAN 9459 of 2014 relating to the case of Dr Abdul Motin –vs- Dr Manisankar Maity. In the proceedings of the aforesaid litigation in the Division Bench of High Court, Calcutta the Ph D degree of NSOU was mentioned as "substandard and not up to the mark". Not only that all the degrees in comparison to its equivalent counter-parts of regular university has been stated as substandard. The matter is now pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and NSOU is one of the defendants.

10. To consider the matter of adoption of the PBAS format for Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) for teachers holding substantive posts of the University as per University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) (4th Amendment), Regulations, 2016.

The matter as aforesaid was discussed at length by the House and was resolved to be kept pending until relevant order/regulations is/are received from the UGC and the State Govt in this regard.

11. To consider matters related to recognition of the University Grants Commission (UGC) under section 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956.

Agenda Note: (a) UGC-DEB (vide their F.No. DEB/ SOU/ Dev.Gr./2014-15; 05/06/2015 read with F.No. 14-1/2016 (DEB-IV); 14/09/2016) urged the SoUs to complete the formalities for 12B status of UGC by the end F.Y. 2015-16 failing which the Development grant of GoI would be discontinued. Accordingly, the UGC was approached (vide Memo No. VC/ 861; Dt. 24/06/2015) to allow 5 yrs. preparation time for acquiring the 12B Status under UGC. It was urged further to continue the disbursement of UGC-DEB grants to the SoUs during the transitory period. (b) Simultaneously, the H.E. Deptt. was approached (vide Memo Nos VC/943, Dt.10/7/2015; VC/11/225, Dt 28.12.2016) for creation of requisite number of teaching posts as per UGC's stipulations for achieving 12B status under UGC Act, 1956. (c) It is also to be noted that UGC-DEB is in the process of prescribing a separate set of stipulations / format for recognition of the SoUs).

Discussed in the House and the Vice-Chancellor was empowered to take necessary actions – as when required.

12. To report on the status/development of the Newtown -Rajarhat Campus of NSOU.

Agenda Note: To meet extreme scarcity of space at Kolkata, nearly three (3) acres of land at Newtown, Kolkata was purchased on leasehold basis from WBHIDCO in order to establish an Integrated Open Campus Cum Regional centre of NSOU under the Principal Head "Education". The university is already in receipt of Rs. 1.48 Crore of construction of boundary wall from the H.E. Deptt., GoWB and the process of construction of the same is now going on by the PWD, GoWB. Simultaneously, in the first phase the University has proposed setting up of a G+5 storied building with total built up area of 12,336 sq.m and this project would be implemented by PWD, GoWB. Accordingly, the rough cost estimate has been sent to the Higher Education Deptt. for issuance of Administrative Approval for the project. On receipt of necessary administrative approval and



allotment of necessary fund as per the total projected cost, the construction of a G+5 storied building in the First Phase with essential supporting structure and allied works can be undertaken so that academic activities in the Campus may be initiated as soon as practicable.

Reported and the House took note of it.

13. To report setting up of Regional Centres (RC) at Jalpaiguri and at Durgapur respectively on 2.87 and 5.0 acres of land. RCs at both these places are almost ready and once handed over the university may start operation at these centres. Be it noted that 13- posts of Officers and Non-Teaching staff (NTS) has been created by the HE Dcptt, GoWB (vide Memo No 464-Edn (U)/1U (NS)-12/16, dt 04.05.2017 and No. 897-Edn (U)/1U (NS)-11/16; Dt.09/08/2017) for the Jalpaiguri RC and the Durgapur RC. Some of these posts have already been advertised after due approval of ROA by the BCW Dept.

Reported and the House took note of it.

ACADEMIC ISSUES

14. It is to be noted that the UGC Open and Distance Learning Regulations, 2017 notified in the Gazette of India on 23.06.2017 stipulates that the Universities should apply for approval/recognition for starting new courses/programmes for the next academic session as per UGC notification vide No. 74-4/2017 (DEB-4) dt 29.06.2017. Placed for approval of EC.

Discussed in the House and the Vice-Chancellor was empowered to take all necessary actions in this regard from time to time – as and when required.

15. To consider the adaptation/execution of DEB-UGC approval [Ref. F.No-2-1/2017(DEB-III/DEB-IV); Dt. 19.05.2017] regarding M.Phil. / Ph.D. course at NSOU in regular mode as per UGC (minimum standards and procedures of award of M.Phil. /Ph.D. degrees) Regulations, 2016. Be it noted that the preparation of a draft Regulation is under the process, which may be sent to the competent authority with the approval of the E.C.

Discussed in the House and the Vice-Chancellor was empowered to constitute a Committee comprising the Heads of the Schools of Studies along with the Registrar, NSOU as Member-Convener and Professor Gautam Paul, Member Exe. Council, NSOU to finalise the draft regulation. Also resolved that the Vice-Chancellor on receipt of the draft Regulation from this committee as aforesaid, be authorised to move the competent authority of the Govt.

16. To consider introduction of Post Graduate courses in regular mode, preferably, for the following lab-based science subjects in view of the increasing demand of higher studies: i) Botany; ii) Chemistry & iii) Scientific Computing.

Resolved that the matter be sent to the UGC-DEB for approval along with supporting documents.

17. To consider the matter of implementation of revised syllabi under CBCS in NSOU as recommended by UGC and WBSCHE (for courses run in F2F mode).

The issue was discussed at length and deferred for the next Executive Council meeting.

- 18. To consider implementation of the following criteria for admission to different laboratory based subjects in BDP & PG level under the aegis of School of Sciences, NSOU in order to maintain the quality of teaching with limited laboratory resources from July 2018 session onwards and to cope with increasing student enrolment in the following programmes:
 - i) Honours Graduate (10+2+3) in Mathematics for PGMT (same as existing criteria of PGGR & PGZO)
 - ii) Passed 10+2 exam. or equivalent with 50% marks in Mathematics for EMT (i.e Hons. In Maths.)
 - iii) Passed 10+2 exam. or equivalent with 55% marks in Geography for EGR (i.e. Hons. In Geogr.)



iv) Passed 10+2 exam. or equivalent with 50% marks in Biology for EZO (i.e. Hons. In Zool.)

Resolved that a Committee be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor comprising of the Heads of Schools and Prof. Goutam Paul, Member Exe. Council, NSOU along with the Registrar, NSOU as the Member-Convener, to consider the implementation of the aforesaid proposal. The report of the said committee should be submitted to the Vice-Chancellor by December, 2017.

19. To consider the proposal of introduction of BA in Education (in ODL mode) under the aegis of School of Education from the 2018-19 academic session.

The House considered the proposal and approved the same in principle.

20. To consider to introduce Post Graduate Course in Sociology (PGSO). Be it noted, that the School has already taken initiative to prepare the syllabus following the latest UGC Guideline. Once the syllabus is finalized, Self-learning Materials (SLMs) will be developed and formal approval of UGC will be sought. The School is currently offering BDP in Sociology (ESO).

The House considered the proposal and approved the same in principle.

21. To consider implementation of a revised course structure/ syllabus of BDP-ECO (B.Com) which may be effective from the academic session 2018-19.

The House considered the proposal and approved the same in principle.

22. To consider implementation of a revised course structure/ syllabus and thorough revision of the course materials of Post Graduate Degree in Commerce (M.Com) w.e.f. 2018-19 session.

The House considered the proposal and approved the same in principle.

23. To consider the proposal of introduction of Bachelor in Social Work (BSW) w.e.f 2018-19 session under the aegis of School of Professional Studies (SPS).

The House considered the proposal and approved the same in principle.

24. To consider the proposal of introduction of MBA w.e.f. 2018-19 session under the aegis of School of Professional Studies (SPS).

The House considered the proposal and approved the same in principle provided recognition is received from the Statutory Authority(ies) concerned.

- 25. To consider the grafting facility for vocational courses as is given to UG/PG courses. *The House approved it in line with UG/PG courses.*
- 26. To consider the re-introduction of PG Diploma in Yoga Education (2-year) w.e.f. July 2018 session (revising the nomenclature of PG Diploma in Sports and Competitive Yoga).

Reported and the House took note of it.

38. To report the opening of new study centres for vocational courses w.e.f July 2016: i) Anjali Social welfare Research Foundation, Howrah ii) Binapani Educational and Welfare Trust, Sriniketan, iii) Pranavananda Institute Management Technology (a unit of Bharat Sevashram Sangha), Pranab Kanya, Hridaypur, North 24 Pgs (N), iv) Ruby General Hospital, v) Asutosh College Training Centre, vi)Nazirpur Rainbow Educational Institute, Murshidabad, vii) Government General Degree College at

The matter was discussed in detail taking into consideration the views of the Ld. Counsel Dr. Chapales Bandyopadhyay on this issue. The contradictions inherent among the different G.O.s issued by the Deptt. of Higher Education, GoWB along with the related Orders of the Finance Dept., GoWB — as pointed out by the said Ld. Counsel were deliberated in the House and it was resolved that a clarification in this regards shall be sought for from the Govt. in Higher Edn. Deptt. and pending receipt of relevant feedback from the Higher Edn. Deptt., GoWB status quo should be maintained.

However, in view of the prolonged service rendered by these 14-employees, the House resolved that the Govt. in Higher Edn. Deptt. be requested to view the matter sympathetically and consider regularisation of their service and extension of the service benefits including CAS/ promotion to them commensurate to their respective lengths of service in the University.

45. To consider on the issue of recruitment process to the two posts of Asst. Librarian (Grade-II) [1-UR and 1-SC] which could not be completed for the following reasons.

Agenda Note:

- a. University published an advertisement stating two posts (1-UR, 1-SC) of Assistant Librarian, Gr-II vide its Memo No: Reg/ 090 Date: 04/02/2015.
- b. Thereafter, during processing of the applications received by the University it was observed that one of these posts was previously occupied by one Shri Tapas Das (UR) who has been absorbed from NIAS during bifurcation of NIAS and creation of NSOU vide G.O No. 14-Edn (HSE)/10M-6/98-dated 21.01.1999 as Library Assistant.
- c. Shri Tapas Das retired on 31.12.2014 as Assistant Librarian Gr II. He was elevated from Library Assistant to Assistant Librarian Gr II (vide G.O No. 4-Edn (U)/1U-59/99 dated 01.01.2008). From this G.O it appeared that the position held by Shri Das was personal to him and thus this post may now be transformed to the initial one.



- d. The "second "post of Assistant Librarian Gr II was created by G.O. No.137-Edn (U) /EH/1U (NS)-03/10, dated, 25th February 2011.
- e. Till then processing of applications of these two posts have been kept in hold.
- f. It is proposed to cancel the said advertisement and to refund the application fees to all the applicants to the said two posts in order to avoid any possible litigation

The matter was discussed at length and it was resolved that the said advertisement be cancelled and such cancellation notice shall be published through news papers with invitation to the candidates to apply before the Registrar, NSOU for refund of fee deposited, along with documentary evidence of deposition of fee.

46. To consider the delegation of administrative power to the Director, Regional Centre for the smooth functioning of the Regional Centres [vide NSOU First Statutes(Revised),2014-Clause13(5)(c)(xviii)]

The House empowered the Vice-Chancellor to take necessary action in this respect from time to time.

- 47. Matters arising with the permission of the chair.
 - a. To report that Gyan Vani Studio is no longer functional, as IGNOU could not resume its radio service despite repeated reminders and the lease agreement between NSOU and the premise owner of Gyan Vani Studio ended on 31.07.2017. It may be noted that Gyan Vani FM Channel of IGNOU has been off air since 01.10.2014.

The House was appraised of the non-functional situation of the Gyan Vani Studio w.e.f. 01/10/2014 due to lack of necessary initiative on part of the authority of IGNOU in spite of repeated reminders from the NSOU from time to time. The House was also briefed about the termination of lease agreement on 31/07/2017, between NSOU and the owner of the premise where the Studio was located marking the closure of the joint collaboration between NSOU and IGNOU in the Gyan Vani FM transmission initiative. The steps taken up so far by IGNOU in dismantling the studio from its present location and its shifting to IGNOU's own premise elsewhere in Kolkata have also been discussed and noted by the House.

b. To consider implementation of a revised course structure/syllabus of Post Graduate Degree in Mathematics (PGMT) which may be effective from the academic session July, 2018 under the aegis of the School of Sciences.

The House considered the proposal and approved the same in principle.

c. To consider implementation of a revised course structure/syllabus as per UGC stipulations and through revision of the course materials (SLM) of Bachelor Degree in Botany (EBT/SBT) which may be effective from the academic session July, 2018 under the aegis of the School of Sciences.

Action taken report on some Agenda resolved in 72nd E.C. Meeting held on 18.08.2017.

Reg. Agenda – 1.: To confirm the proceedings of 71st meeting of the Executive Council held on 14.03.2016 (vide Annexure - I). In Agenda item -7, the name of the nominee- Dr. Nirupama Bhattacharya, Co-ordinator, Burdwan Raj College Study Centre, under Sl. No. (a) of Executive Council on the Academic Council, be replaced as she has been appointed as the Director, Kalyani Regional Centre, NSOU on 01/06/2017. The matter was left to the Vice-Chancellor.

A.T: Necessary action in this regard has been taken by nominating Dr. Tilak Nath Ghosh, Coordinator, Netaji Mahavidyalaya Study Centre, Arambag.

Reg. Agenda – 6, Table –I, SI. No. 11: The matter relates to Dr. Gahul Amin, Asstt. Prof. of Physics wherein the House resolved that a 3-member fact finding committee be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor, which would look into the issues –as aforesaid and if necessary it may interact with the officials/ faculties concerned and Dr. Amin in person and also could ask for production of relevant documents as may be necessary and submit its report to the Vice-Chancellor. The Vice-Chancellor on receipt of the said report would be at liberty to take necessary decision in the matter which in turn would be reported to the next Executive Council Meeting.

A.T.: The 3-Member Fact Finding Committee stands constituted comprising of: a) Dr. Debajyoti Konar, Registrar, Presidency University – Member; b) Shri Debdatta Roy, Registrar (Actg.), Rabindra Bharati Univ. – Member and c) Shri Mohan Kumar Chattopadhyay, Registrar, NSOU – Member – Convener. The said committee submitted its report to the Vice-Chancellor and on the basis of such report Hon'ble vice Chancellor has issued order wherein the probation period of Dr. Amin has been extended upto 19th August, 2019.

Reg. Agenda-11. Related to recognition of the University Grants Commission (UGC) under section 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956 was discussed in the House and the Vice-Chancellor was empowered to take necessary actions – as and when required.

A.T. –State Govt. was moved to create required nos. of faculties in favour of Netaji Subhas Open University. University received the sanction of additional 106 posts of teachers (23 Professor, 45 Associate Professor and 47 Assistant Professor). Thereafter UGC was moved for initiating the process of 12 B recognition. UGC has sent a proforma for submitting information in respect the University but the said proforma relates to pre-DEB period, which requires 40 acres of land to apply for 12 B status. The matter is being taken up further with UGC for clarification.

ACADEMIC ISSUES

Reg. Agenda – 14 It is to be noted that the UGC Open and Distance Learning Regulations, 2017 notified in the Gazette of India on 23.06.2017 stipulates that the Universities should apply for approval/recognition for starting new courses/programmes for the next academic session as per UGC notification vide No. 74-4/2017 (DEB-4) dt 29.06.2017. The issue was discussed in the House and the Vice-Chancellor was empowered to take all necessary actions in this regard from time to time – as and when required.

A.T. The process of filling up of formats on-line at DEB-UGC was initiated and the University received approval of all the thirty programmes in three phases for academic sessions 2018-19 to 2022-23.

Reg. Agenda – 15: for considering the adaptation/execution of DEB-UGC approval [Ref. F.No-2-1/2017(DEB-III/DEB-IV); Dt. 19.05.2017] regarding M.Phil. / Ph.D. course at NSOU in regular



mode as per UGC (minimum standards and procedures of award of M.Phil. /Ph.D. degrees) Regulations, 2016 was discussed in the House and the Vice-Chancellor was empowered to constitute a Committee comprising the Heads of the Schools of Studies along with the Registrar, NSOU as Member-Convener and Professor Gautam Paul, Member Exe. Council, NSOU to finalise the draft regulation. Also resolved that the Vice-Chancellor on receipt of the draft Regulation from this committee as aforesaid, be authorised to move the competent authority of the Govt.

- A.T.: The Committee as indicated above was constituted as follows:

The Ph.D Regulation was finalized by the said committee and has been duly approved by Vice-Chancellor and now the same is being placed in 73rd EC meeting for its approval as per provision of the Statute of the University.

Reg. Agenda-16: for introduction of Post Graduate courses in regular mode, for the following lab-based science subjects – viz.: i) Botany; ii) Chemistry & iii) Scientific Computing.

The matter may be reconsidered in the light of UGC Regulations, 2017 regarding OUs and DDEs of Dual mode universities.

Reg. Agenda -18 for implementation of the following criteria for admission to different laboratory based subjects in BDP & PG level under the aegis of School of Sciences, NSOU in order to maintain the quality of teaching with limited laboratory resources from July 2018 session onwards and to cope with increasing student enrolment in the following programmes:

- i) Honours Graduate (10+2+3) in Mathematics for PGMT (same as existing criteria of PGGR & PGZO)
- ii) Passed 10+2 exam. or equivalent with 50% marks in Mathematics for EMT (i.e Hons. In Maths.)
- iii) Passed 10+2 exam. or equivalent with 55% marks in Geography for EGR (i.e. Hons. In Geogr.)
- iv) Passed 10+2 exam. or equivalent with 50% marks in Biology for EZO (i.e. Hons. In Zool.)
