Report on Workshop on Technical Writing, 11th April 2019.

A workshop was organized by the School of Humanities, NSOU, in collaboration with Department of Basic Science and Humanities, Camellia Institute of Technology at the Institute premises on 11th April 2019. The workshop was on Technical Writing for the B. Tech first year and second year students. Thirty-five Engineering students were present for the workshop.

The workshop was attended by the Head of the Department of Basic Sciences and Humanities, Professor Biswajit Singha Roy, the TIC of Mechanical Engineering Department, Professor S Dey, and four other distinguished faculties of the Institute. Professor Dey inaugurated the Workshop. The workshop was conducted by Sumana Bandyopadhyay, began at 2.30 pm. Beginning with a presentation on technical writing, it was followed by six activities, a writing quiz game and a mind-mapping activity.

The mind-mapping activity was on writing in Media for the education systems in India and it was composed in a Free Mind software, a free mind mapping application written in Java.
