<u>Guidelines for Dissertation (Paper-15) for MSW Part-II (old syllabus)</u> <u>2022-23 session</u>

Dept. of Social Work under the aegis of School of Professional Studies has revised the guideline for conducting / writing Dissertation (Paper 15) for learners of **MSW Part II**.

Social Work is a profession as well as an academic discipline, which aims to enhance thesocial functioning of the Individual/Groups and Communities, by the application of somevery scientifically developed methods. The discipline of Social Work is committed to work in the different levels Micro, Mezzoas well as Macro level, i.e. it works directly with the individuals and small group at the same time it works with large communities, and engages itself with in advocacy, networking as well as policy formulation.

According to the International Federation of Social Work (IFSW), 2014 "Social work is a practicebasedprofession and an academic discipline that promotes social change and development, social cohesion, and the empowerment and liberation of people. Principles of social justice, human rights, collective responsibility and respect for diversities are central to social work. Underpinned by theories of social work, social sciences, humanities and indigenous knowledge, social work engages people and structures to address life challenges and enhancewellbeing".

Before going any further we must have to realise the fact that, human beings often fall easy prey to these social problems, from which they cannot come out of their own. Thus we first have to understand, why do people suffer from these problems, how does these problems arise, who are responsible for creating these problems, to what extend do these problem exist in our societies, how do we perceive such problems and how can we put an end to these problems. It is the duty of the Social Workers to answer these questions, and this can be done by understanding some theories and perspectives of Social Work which will help us to go deep into the matter and frame our views in this connection These theories help us to know why certain things happened and what may be its consequences in the future. Social Work Discipline, is to a great extend influenced by Sociology and Psychology. Thus most of the theories are borrowed from some allied disciplines while some theories are developed keeping in mind the core indigenous perspectives of Social Work also.

Social Work Research Methodologies-

Social Work must have its own indigenous methodologies to investigate cause and effects of the social problems. This is a discipline which explores, analyse, describes and understandthe various social relationships and their impact on the lives of the human beings. Therefore, Social Work may adopt both Positivist as well as Heuristic epistemologies for carrying out its investigations. Positivist approach will help us to carry out an evidence-based Research, and the information thus gathered will be helpful in chalking out more effective problem solving practices. The Heuristic approach on the other hand helps to understand the problem from the respondent's own perspective and thus gives a rich detail to the problem and increases the scope for inclusion of marginalized segment also. Thus the Researcher must be innovative enough in planning a Research Methodology whichwould be in accordance with the area selected for carrying out the research.

Format for writing the Dissertation

The learners are expected to remember and incorporate the following points while writingtheir Dissertation

- Section of the Topic-The topic must be pertaining to Social Work issues or relevant social issues/problems and have enough Scopes for Social Work Intervention/practice.
- Title of the Study- The Title must highlight the Social Work Problem/issue along with the Target Group andGeographical Area where the study would be conducted.

<u>CHAPTER 1</u>

Introduction-A brief prelude about the problem/issue.

Significance of the Problem-

- Genesis of the Problems which should be substantiated with enough statistical data
- Contemporary problems
- Problem in International and National scenario
- Relation of the study with areas/ theories of Social Work

CHAPTER 2

Review of Literature

Review of Literature is a very important part of any Dissertation, as it helps us to understand thetopic of research by reviewing the already existing secondary data. Thorough Literature Reviewenables us to plan our Research Design, frame our Objectives and chalk out Methodologies. As many as contemporary (may be within 10-years) Journals/Research Papers/ articles as possible tobe reviewed with proper analysis. Following table may be used to give the analysis of the LiteratureReview.

Based on the thorough Review of Literature, a researcher would be able to figure out the research gaps andthus frame the objectives of study and will find out the scope and need for further studies.

Rationale of the Study

Why the particular topic was selected by the learner must be specified here from the learner's ownperspective. In this segment the Researcher would justify why she /he has taken up the given studyand how will the study help in near future.

Objective of the study

The Researcher would give an idea about what is to be explored from the study. The Objectives can limit to 4-5 as per the requirement. Should avoid overlapping of the objectives.

CHAPTER 3

Methodology

What would be the relevant or pertinent methodology for your study and why is it important.

Research Approach

Research Approach to be specified as per Qualitative / Quantitative or Eclectic.

Universe and Sample of the study

Define the Universe and Sample. Logic for choosing sampling method and the sample size as per your study.

Research Design

Explain your Research Design as per your study. Whether the research is Explanatory or Exploratory or Descriptive type. Give your justification for choosing a particular Research Design.

Tools of Data Collection-

Chalk out specific data collection tools for Primary and Secondary Methods. Illustrate the process for Data compilation. Ethical Concern (Consent) if any must be taken from the concern stakeholders.

CHAPTER 4

Profile of Respondents-

Statistical analysis or the case studies/oral histories must be given and analyzed as per as theQualitative/Quantitative or Eclectic Research Design.

CHAPTER 5

Major findings

Results of the data analysis based on the objective of the study must be given here systematically.

CHAPTER-6

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Discussion and Conclusion

Summarization and drawing conclusion based on the findings. Your observations and suggestions about the study. Scope for Social work interventions must be given, along with the role of Social Workers, NGOs andGovernment organization if any.

References and Bibliography

Proper citation/references/bibliography should be given to avoid plagiarism in APA style with latest version.
