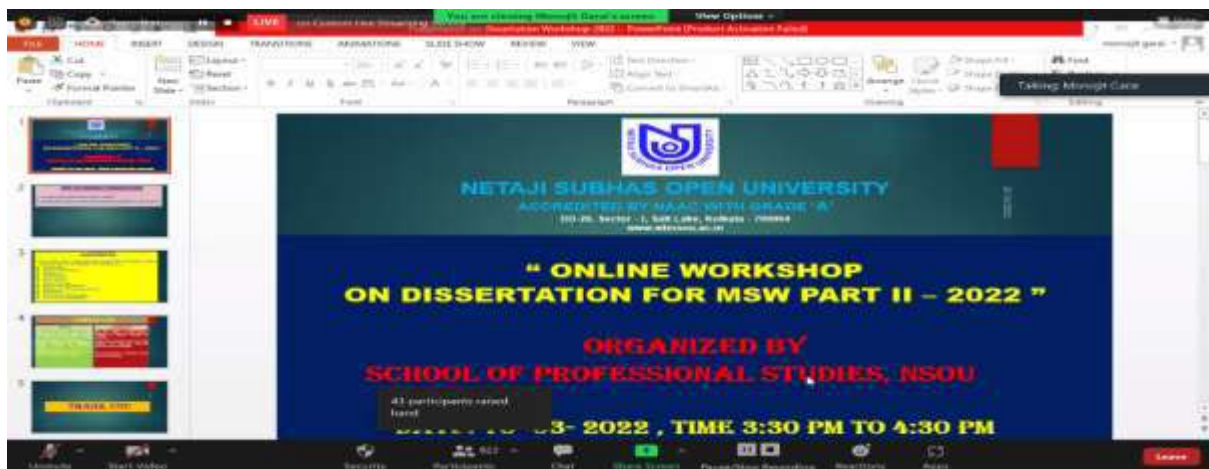




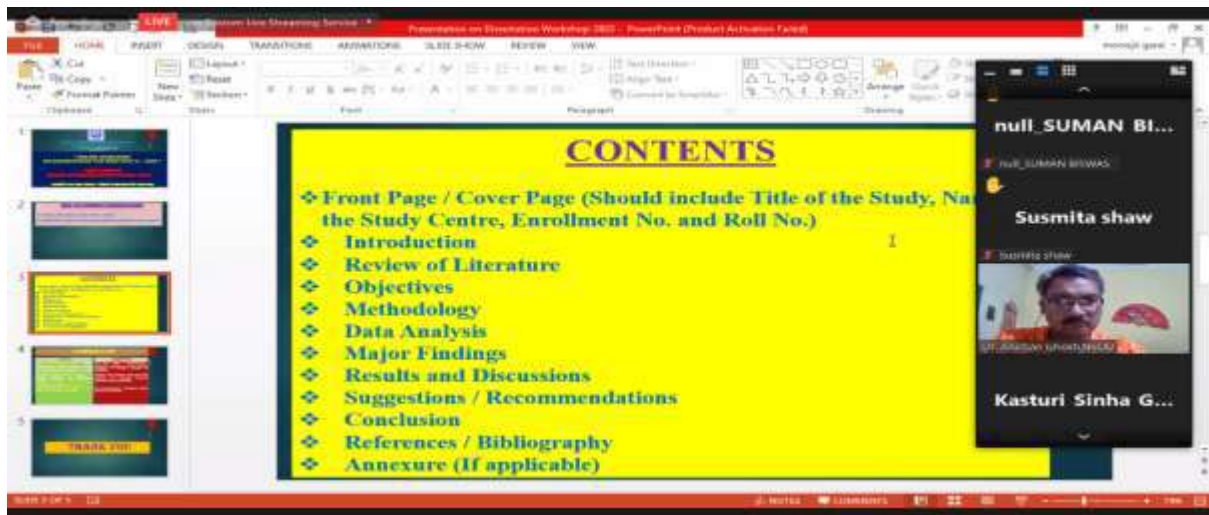
**Report on
Online Workshop on Dissertation for MSW Part II
(Batch: January, 2021)
Date: 13 March 2022**

An Online Workshop on Dissertation (Ist Phase) for MSW Part II (Batch: January, 2021 and Before) was organized by the Department of Social Work, SPS on 13th March'22 through Zoom Platform as well as YouTube at 3:30 pm-4:30 pm. The faculty members of Social Work Department as well as Director of SPS (i/c), Prof Anirban Ghosh were present for the programme. About 976 participants attended the programme.

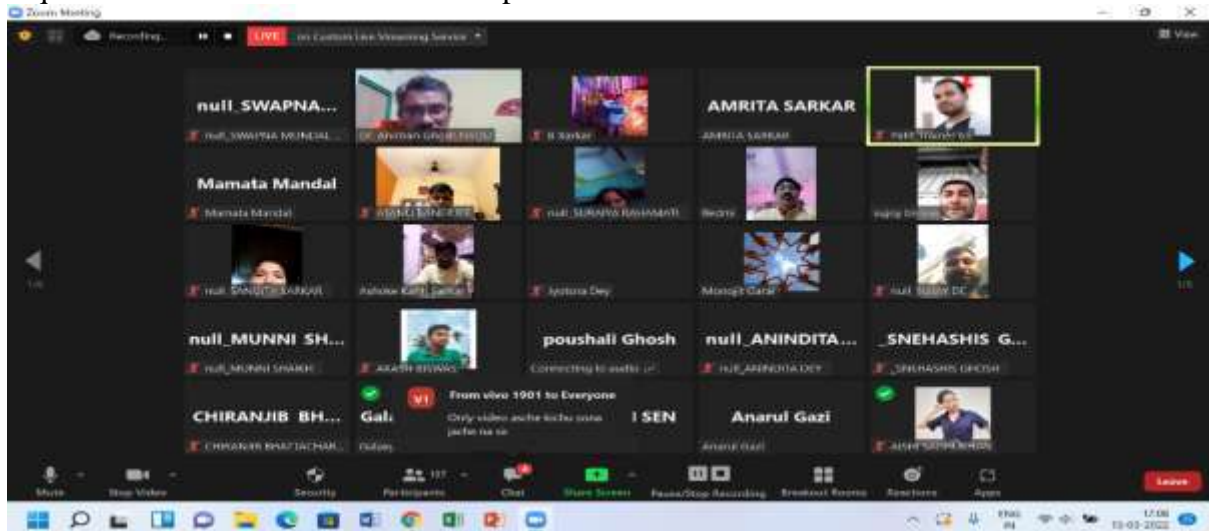
Prof Anirban Ghosh briefly discussed about the aim of the programme. He clearly mentioned that it is mandatory to attend the workshop on Dissertation by the learners, as they have to attach the e-certificate along with their Report at the time of submission, and without the e-certificate the dissertation is liable to be cancelled. Prof Ghosh told that the internal faculties may guide the learners in preparing their dissertation. The learners may meet their guides in the Regional Centres after prior appointments. He urged the learners not to share their personal details with anyone as this may cause problems in future.



Ms Kasturi Sinha Ghosh, Asst Prof in Social Work, discussed how to go about the dissertation. She asked the learners to select a topic which is related to Social Work and where they may be able to give Social Work Interventions. She focused her discussion on how one may frame the objectives and develop the methodology. She urged the learners to go through the available materials thoroughly and choose a topic which is according to their area of interest. The geographical area for conducting the study may be such that they may find it convenient to collect the data easily without many challenges. According to her; the methodology which is the heart of any research must be developed with lots of accuracy to get the best result.



Mr Monojit Garai, Asst Prof in Social Work, presented a PPT where he lucidly explained each and every step which is required for carrying out a dissertation. He focused his discussion on the importance of Review of Literature and tools of data collection. He shared the DO's and Don'ts for writing the Dissertation report. He requested the learners to strictly refrain from submitting scanned reports, duplicate reports or reports without any e-certificates. He further requested the learners to choose a topic which is relevant to Social Work.



Mr Kalyan Kumar Sanyal, Associate Prof. in Social Work, opined that the learners are free to choose any topic must have a Social Work angle to it, which most of the learners fail to do. He said that there should be a link between the various sections of the dissertation and we expect a much matured presentation from the learners of Post Graduation level.

Then the programme was opened for discussion for the learners. Several queries were raised by the learners which were resolved by the faculty members.
