Report on Offline Special Lecture Programme (OSLP)

The Department of Sociology, School of Social Sciences, NSOU has hosted an **Offline Special Lecture Programme (OSLP)** within the context of **Extended Counselling Session (ECS)** at the **Jalpaiguri Regional Campus, NSOU**, with the memo number **SSS/516**, dated **14/06/2022** for the **1st & 2nd Semester of the Sociology Honours Under-Graduate CBCS Programme (HSO)**, and **BDP ESO 2nd and 3rd Year**. The event ran from **10:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.** from **June 17 to July 12, 2022**. The event was held offline in the Jalpaiguri Regional Campus of NSOU. Under the direction of the director of the school of social sciences at NSOU, **Mr. Anupam Roy**, assistant professor of sociology, organised the event.

The programme was designed to allow sociology students at the Jalpaiguri Regional campus of NSOU to get additional assistance within the framework of Extended Counselling Sessions (ECS). According to Memo No. **NSOU/JRC/04/2022-23**, issued **April 26, 2022**, the OSLP was created in response to feedback received from learners in the preceding **Learners' Sensitization and OSLP Program**. The programme was intended for particular **sociology students in the North Bengal region**. The entire event was directed and performed only by university faculty members stationed at NSOU's Jalpaiguri Regional Centre. The university is under no requirement to contribute financially to this reference in any fashion.



On the scheduled day, the Offline Special Learning Program (OSLP) got underway. The appointed university faculty members make every effort to meet the students' academic demands, even though attendance varies from day to day. They use PPP presentations to demonstrate their counselling sessions, offer further reading material on the subjects, set up labs for the students, and explain the program's syllabus as well as the assignment and exam question formats. After the OSLP programme was accomplished on July 12, 2022, students filled out a feedback form, shared their subjective experience and difficulties, and appealed for further academic sessions. According to the

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feedback statistics, they valued and benefited from these OSLP sessions and expressed a desire for additional offline programmes and OSLP sessions in the future.

The event culminated with a brief feedback and interaction session between tutors and learners. This workshop dispelled a lot of misconceptions and myths about the design and operation of teaching-learning-evaluation systems. Everyone had a great opportunity to learn from it.
