


<u>Report on One-Day National Level Interdisciplinary Student Webinar</u> <u>on Understanding Indian Society</u>

Organized by Department of Sociology, School of Social Sciences, Netaji Subhas Open University in collaboration with Centre For Social Studies, School of Social Sciences, NSOU

With the memo number NSOU/JRC/03/2022-23, dated 25/04/2022, students and learners of UG and PG courses from all over the country were invited to present their independent papers on "Understanding Indian society" at a One-Day National Level Interdisciplinary Student Webinar, which was sponsored by the Department of Sociology, School of Social Sciences, Netaji Subhas Open University in partnership with The Centre for Social Studies, School of Social Sciences, NSOU, on June 30, 2022, from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm. The student webinar was originally slated to take place on May 26th, 2022, but with the vide memo no. 479, dated May 23, 2022, it was extended to June 30th, 2022, to accommodate demand for an extension from students and to reach further unreached students. With the support of Schoolguru's technical assistance, the event was solely conducted online by using Zoom Platform. The university is not required to give any kind of financial backing for this reference. The students never were charged for participation or registration. In an approach to assess the degree to which classroom instruction, texts, and lectures were able to affect the students' knowledge of the topic, the desired objectives were to involve learners more in productive activities and make research writing more exciting.

The Director of the School of Social Sciences, NSOU supervised the program's execution. The professors of the Sociology Department, SSS, NSOU organised and led the entire webinar. Mr. Anupam Roy gave an introduction to the event, while Dr. Srabanti Choudhury offered the welcoming address. Dr. Kumkum Sarkar served as Chairperson of the



programme, while Prof. Mondal served as Coordinator. Nine people presented papers during the webinar, which ran from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm. The other 10 people joined in as webinar attendees. The attendees came from Rabindra Bharati University, Calcutta University, and Meghalaya University in addition to our own university. Besides sociology, papers from history and library information science were also submitted. The webinar as a whole comprises a vast diversity of expertise from several distinct transdisciplinary domains.



and nine of those papers were successfully deployed by the participants.






Figure: 01 Webinar Paper Presentation




There were 19 attendees in all who participated in the webinar, of them 4 were department personnel, 1 was an IT technician, and the rest 14 were regular webinar participants.

University Participation Ratio





Figure:04 University Participation Ratio





The papers submitted are not only from the Sociology subject, but also from History and Library Information Science. There were nine papers from Sociology, two from History, and one from Library and Information Science.




Figure: 05 School of Discipline Ratio



In terms of participants' academic standing, there were 1 research scholar, 2 postgraduates, and 9 graduate students.





Figure: 07 Participant Academic Standard Ratio
