About the National Student Seminar:

Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi's 153rd birth anniversary was celebrated on 2nd October, 2022. The Department of History, School of Social Sciences in association with Centre for Social Studies took this opportunity to pay homage to the 'Father of the Nation' by organising a National - level Student Seminar for the UG/PG students/learners enrolled in the Universities and Colleges of India (online mode) on 17th November, 2022.

To ensure that the distinctive ideology of M.K. Gandhi in creating a new India on the basis of social equality and social justice, principles of truth, morality and non-violence is circulated among the members of the younger generation to make them aware of an alternative lifestyle which encourages in the fullest development of one's personality, essential to face the challenges of today's competitive world.


➤ Preparation for the Seminar: A notification with all necessary details related to the National- level Student Seminar titled, 'M.K. Gandhi- His Ideas on and Principles of Social Reconstruction and Basic Education: Their Relevance Today' was uploaded on NSOU website well in advance. This notice was also circulated through WhatsApp and word of mouth.

This National-level seminar was open to all PG/UG students/learners enrolled in the Universities and Colleges of India. The paper presenters for the seminar were selected on the basis of papers submitted by them on the given topic. The papers were judged strictly on the basis of merit by the Department of History, NSOU. The learners were notified in advance about the acceptance of their respective papers. They were required to make power point presentations for the webinar. Learners who were not adept at making PPTs were helped by the teachers of the History Department, School of Social Sciences, NSOU in this regard. Since this was a student seminar no fees was charged. Registration was free for all student paper presenters and participants.

- **MINUTIAE OF NATIONAL-LEVEL STUDENT SEMINAR (ONLINE MODE):**
- Inaugural Session
- Welcome Address: The programme started at 12 noon with the Welcome Address by Dr. Manoj Kumar Haldar, Assistant Professor of Political Science and Coordinator, NSOU School for Social Studies. He warmly welcomed the faculties, paper presenters and other participants from all colleges and universities to the online seminar and expressed belief that the seminar would be beneficial to all.
- ♣ Introduction of the Topic: Professor Chandan Basu, Director, School of Social Sciences and Professor of History, NSOU elucidated the significance of the topic of the seminar. He stated that the Gandhian principles upholding non-violence and a value system based on morality is of much relevance in the contemporary world which does not promote cooperation and harmony between man and man instead promotes a spirit of a cut throat competition leading not only to the degradation of natural resources but also creates a crisis in the human civilisation. Professor Chandan Bose expressed this appreciation that the students have responded to share their views on the relevance of this topic.
- From the Vice-Chancellor's Desk: On this occasion, the Department was extremely honoured to receive an encouraging letter from the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of NSOU,

Professor Ranjan Chakraborty. Dr. Ritu Mathur, Associate Professor and Head, Department of History, read aloud the encouraging message of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor to the participants. In his message, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor stated that the seminar provided a forum for students from various universities and colleges in India to discuss the thoughts and ideas of M.K. Gandhi. He greatly appreciated the continuous effort of the Department of History to reach out to the learners.

The Inaugural session was compered by Dr. Ritu Mathur Mitra and Debarati Banerjee. Later Debarati Banerjee conducted over the presentation of the papers in Sessions - I & II.




Session I: There were 8 paper presenters in the first session namely, the following:

Each paper presenter was given 8 minutes to present her/his paper using a power point presentation. The effort put in by the students to prepare their power point presentations with relevant images was commendable, especially given that some of them were unfamiliar with ICT tools. All papers presented in the first session were well researched and well -articulated. The topic was analysed from various aspects by the presenters. Each presenter explained his/her opinion about the relevance of Gandhian thought on social reconstruction and basic education. Several new angles and issues were projected in the papers which were thought provoking.

- Session I- Question-Answer, Discussion: The discussion was extremely beneficial. Questions were thrown from the students' platform, and discussions ensued. Faculty members actively participated in the discussion, contributing findings and comments. The webinar was enlivened by a discussion between Dr. Ritu Mathur Mitra, Debarati Banerjee and Inudia Marandi, presenter of a paper highlighting Gandhi's perception of the Adivasis and their welfare.


Session II Paper Presentation was ably coordinated by Debarati Banerjee and Dr. Ritu Mathur Mitra.
